## SENATE BILL 5348

Read first time 01/20/1999. Referred to Committee on State & Local Government.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the membership and responsibilities of the state
- 2 library commission; amending RCW 27.04.010, 27.04.020, 27.04.030, and
- 3 27.04.045; adding a new section to chapter 27.04 RCW; and repealing RCW
- 4 27.04.050, 27.04.100, and 27.04.110.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 27.04.010 and 1943 c 207 s 1 are each amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 There shall be a state library, with a state library commission to
- 9 <u>serve as the library's governing board</u>, and a state librarian ((as
- 10 the)) to serve as its chief executive officer ((in charge thereof)).
- 11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 27.04.020 and 1984 c 287 s 58 are each amended to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 <u>(1)</u> A state library commission is ((hereby)) created ((which)) and
- 14 shall consist of ((the superintendent of public instruction, who shall
- 15 be ex officio chairman of the commission, and four)) five commissioners
- 16 appointed by the governor((, one of whom shall be a library trustee at
- 17 the time of appointment and one a certified librarian actually engaged
- 18 in library work at the time of appointment)).

(2) The ((first appointments shall be for terms of one, two, three, 1 and four years respectively, and thereafter one commissioner shall be 2 3 appointed each year to serve for a four year term)) commission 4 appointment expiring in July 1999 shall thereafter be filled by a certified librarian actually engaged in library work at the time of 5 appointment. The commission appointment expiring in July 2000 shall 6 7 thereafter be filled by a member of the general public. The commission 8 appointment expiring in July 2001 shall thereafter be filled by a 9 representative from the executive or legislative branches of Washington state government. The commission appointment expiring in July 2002 10 shall thereafter be filled by a library trustee at the time of 11 appointment. The position held by the superintendent of public 12 instruction shall be filled by an educator with knowledge in library 13 and information technology policy, with an initial expiration date of 14 2003. A full term is five years. Commissioners may serve up to two 15 consecutive full terms, serving until reappointed or replaced. 16 17 Vacancies shall be filled by appointments for the unexpired terms. An unexpired term of more than two and one-half years is considered a full 18 19 term for purposes of reappointment. Former commissioners may be reconsidered for an appointment after the lapse of an additional five 20 years. The governor may remove a commissioner for cause, in accordance 21 with RCW 43.06.070. Each commissioner shall be compensated in 22 accordance with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel 23 24 expenses incurred in the actual performance of their duties in 25 accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

26 **Sec. 3.** RCW 27.04.030 and 1987 c 330 s 401 are each amended to 27 read as follows:

The state library commission:

- 29 (1) May make such rules under chapter 34.05 RCW as may be deemed 30 necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
- 31 (2) Shall set general policy <u>and strategic</u> direction<u>s</u> pursuant to 32 the provisions of this chapter;
- 33 (3) Shall monitor agency progress toward its goals and objectives;
- 34 (4) Shall exert leadership in the development of information access

 (((5) Shall have authority to contract with any agency of the state of Washington for the purpose of providing library materials, supplies, and equipment and employing assistants as needed for the development, growth, and operation of any library facilities or services of such agency;

(6)) (7) Shall have authority to contract with any public library in the state for that library to render library service to the blind and/or physically handicapped throughout the state. The state library commission shall have authority to compensate such public library for the cost of the service it renders under such contract;

 $((\frac{7}{}))$  (8) May adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW for the allocation of  $(\frac{any}{})$  grants of state, federal, or private funds  $(\frac{for}{})$  17 library purposes);

((\(\frac{(\frac{1}{8}\)}{1}\)) (9) Shall have authority to accept and to expend in accordance with the terms thereof ((\(\frac{2}{8}\))) grants of federal, state, local, or private funds ((\(\frac{2}{8}\))) become available to the state for library purposes)). For the purpose of qualifying to receive such grants, the state library commission is authorized to make ((\(\frac{2}{8}\))) applications and reports ((\(\frac{2}{8}\)) required by the ((\(\frac{2}{8}\))) government or appropriate private entity as a condition thereto)) grantor;

((<del>9)</del> Shall have the authority to provide for the sale of library material in accordance with RCW 27.12.305;)) and

(10) ((Shall have authority to establish rules and regulations for, and prescribe and hold examinations to test, the qualifications of those seeking certificates as librarians.

(a) The commission shall grant librarians' certificates without examination to applicants who are graduates of library schools accredited by the American library association for general library training, and shall grant certificates to other applicants when it has satisfied itself by examination that the applicant has attainments and abilities equivalent to those of a library school graduate and is qualified to carry on library work ably and efficiently.

(b) The commission shall require a fee of not less than one dollar nor greater than that required to recover the costs associated with the

application to be paid by each applicant for a librarian's certificate.
Money paid as fees shall be deposited with the state treasurer.

- (c) A library serving a community having over four thousand population shall not have in its employ, in the position of librarian or in any other full-time professional library position, a person who does not hold a librarian's certificate issued by the commission or its predecessor.
- (d) A full-time professional library position, as intended by this subsection, is one that requires, in the opinion of the commission, a knowledge of books and of library technique equivalent to that required for graduation from an accredited library school.
- 12 (e) The provisions of this subsection apply to every library serving a community having over four thousand population and to every 13 14 library operated by the state or under its authority, including 15 libraries of institutions of higher learning: PROVIDED, That nothing 16 in this subsection applies to the state law library or to county law libraries)) Shall establish content-related standards for common 17 formats and agency indexes for state agency-produced information. In 18 developing these standards, the commission is encouraged to seek 19 involvement of, and comments from, public and private entities with an 20 interest in such standards. 21
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 27.04 RCW to read as follows:
- 24 library serving a community having over four thousand population, nor any library operated by the state or under its 25 authority, may have in its employ, in the position of librarian or in 26 any other full-time professional library position, a person who does 27 not hold a librarian's certificate issued by the commission or its 28 29 predecessor. A full-time professional library position, is one that requires, in the opinion of the commission, a knowledge of information 30 resources and library/information service delivery equivalent to that 31 required for graduation from an accredited library education program. 32 33 This section does not apply to the state law library or to county law libraries. - 17 (2) Managing and administering the state library;

- (3) (8) Serving as the depository for newspapers published in the state of Washington thus providing a central location for a valuable historical record for scholarly, personal, and commercial reference and circulation;
- 7 ((\(\frac{(4)}{1}\)) (9) Promoting and facilitating electronic access to public 8 information and services, including providing, or providing for, a 9 service that identifies, describes, and provides location information 10 for government information through electronic means, and that assists 11 government agencies in making their information more readily available 12 to the public;
- (((5) Establishing content-related standards for common formats and agency indexes for state agency produced information. In developing these standards, the commission is encouraged to include the state archives, the department of information services, and public and academic libraries;

- $((\frac{(8)}{(8)}))$  (13) Providing for library and information service to residents and staff of state-supported residential institutions;
- $((\frac{(9)}{)})$  (14) Providing for library and information services to persons throughout the state who are blind and/or physically handicapped;

- (((10))) (15) Assisting individuals and groups such as libraries,
  library boards, governing bodies, and citizens throughout the state
  toward the establishment and development of library services;

  ((11))) (16) Making studies and surveys of library needs in order
- 4 ((<del>(11)</del>)) <u>(16)</u> Making studies and surveys of library needs in order 5 to provide, expand, enlarge, and otherwise improve access to library 6 facilities and services throughout the state; <u>and</u>
- 7  $((\frac{12}{12}))$  <u>(17)</u> Serving as  $(\frac{1}{12})$  an interlibrary loan, 8 information, reference, and referral  $(\frac{1}{12})$  resource for all 9 libraries in the state  $(\frac{1}{12})$
- 10 (13) Assisting in the provision of direct library and information 11 services to individuals;
- (14) Overseeing of the Washington library network in accordance with chapters 27.26 and 43.105 RCW. This subsection shall expire on June 30, 1997)). The state library may charge lending fees to other libraries who charge the state library for similar services. Money paid as fees shall be retained by the state library as a recovery of costs.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** The following acts or parts of acts are each repealed:
- 20 (1) RCW 27.04.050 and 1984 c 152 s 3 & 1943 c 207 s 3;
- 21 (2) RCW 27.04.100 and 1990 c 68 s 1; and
