1 AN ACT Relating to the endorsement of school sealant endorsed
2 dental hygienists; adding new sections to chapter 18.29 RCW; and
3 creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that access to
6 preventive and restorative oral health services by low-income children
7 is currently restricted by complex regulatory, financial, cultural, and
8 geographic barriers that have resulted in a large number of children
9 suffering unnecessarily from dental disease. The legislature also
10 finds that very early exposure to oral health care can reverse this
11 disease in many cases, thereby significantly reducing costs of
12 providing dental services to low-income populations.

13 It is the intent of the legislature to address the problem of poor
14 access to oral health care by providing for school-based sealant
15 programs through the endorsement of dental hygienists.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A dental hygienist licensed under this
17 chapter may apply for endorsement by the department of health as a
18 school sealant endorsed dental hygienist upon completion of the

1 Washington state sealant guidelines and training as developed or
2 approved by the department of health. The secretary of health may
3 adopt rules to implement sections 2 through 4 of this act.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** (1) For low-income, rural, and other at-risk
5 populations and in coordination with local public health jurisdictions,
6 dental hygienists who are school sealant endorsed under section 2 of
7 this act may assess for and apply sealants in public and private
8 schools.

9 (2) A dental hygienist endorsed under section 2 of this act shall
10 ensure that each patient for whom the dental hygienist applies sealants
11 has the opportunity to be examined by a dentist within twelve months
12 after the application of the sealant.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** (1) The school sealant endorsement program
14 will accept applications upon the establishment of the endorsement
15 course by the secretary, or by July 1, 2000, whichever is sooner.

16 (2) The department of health shall report to the legislature by
17 December 1, 2003, on the impact of granting school sealant endorsements
18 to dental hygienists to assess for and apply sealants in public and
19 private schools.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** Sections 2 through 4 of this act are each
21 added to chapter 18.29 RCW.

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
