- 1 AN ACT Relating to business and occupation tax credits for 2 educational expenses at private K-12 schools; adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 82.04 RCW; providing an effective date; and declaring an
- 4 emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 82.04 RCW 7 to read as follows:
- 8 In computing the tax imposed under this chapter, a credit is
- 9 allowed against the amount of tax otherwise due under this chapter
- 10 equal to the amount of scholarships granted during the tax year for
- 11 educational expenses of students incurred in attending private K-12
- 12 schools, subject to the following limitations:
- 13 (1) No credit may be taken in excess of four percent of the tax
- 14 liability for the year;
- 15 (2) No more than one hundred scholarships may be given by the
- 16 company in the year and used as credit under this section;
- 17 (3) No more than one-half of a company's scholarships may be used
- 18 for students who are children of proprietors, partners, directors,
- 19 shareholders, or employees of the company;

- 1 (4) No credit may be taken unless annual tax liability is equal to 2 or greater than two thousand five hundred dollars;
- 3 (5) No credit in excess of one hundred thousand dollars may be 4 claimed by an individual business for the year; and
- 5 (6) No credit may carry over to a subsequent tax year.
- The department shall provide a simplified procedure for claiming the credit authorized under this section, including a simple report
- 8 form.
- 9 As used in this section, "educational expenses" means tuition 10 expenses.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 12 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 13 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 14 July 1, 1999.
