SENATE BILL 5455

State of Washington 56th Legislature 1999 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to anadromous salmonid fishing; adding new sections
- 2 to chapter 77.12 RCW; creating a new section; and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that:
- 6 (a) Sport fishing is an enjoyable, healthy, lifelong activity that
- 7 is enjoyed by many families;
- 8 (b) Anadromous salmonids are a treasure of the state of Washington
- 9 that provide unparalleled sport fishing opportunities;
- 10 (c) Without proper care and consideration, Washington's anadromous
- 11 salmonids and their spawning grounds can be unintentionally hurt by
- 12 sport fishers, with long-term consequences for the survival of the
- 13 species;
- 14 (d) Every effort that is made to help preserve the precious
- 15 resource of anadromous salmonids in Washington, no matter how small, is
- 16 important;
- 17 (e) It can often be difficult to distinguish between species of
- 18 anadromous salmonids and sport fishers may unintentionally take a
- 19 scarce fish that is needed for species protection;

- 1 (f) Catch and release fishing is beneficial to both sport fishers 2 and fish but must be done properly to prevent harm to the fish;
- 3 (g) The state's fishing laws and rules are useful for preserving 4 our fishing resources but, without study, can be difficult for sport 5 fishers to locate and follow;
- 6 (h) There is a need for young sport fishers to be educated as to 7 what they can do to enjoy their sport while helping to preserve the 8 fish and environment;
- 9 (i) It is in the state's best interests to educate sport fishers, 10 young and old;
- (j) It is necessary for the preservation of the species that all young sport fishers who engage in sport fishing in Washington are educated about anadromous salmonids; and
- 14 (k) Education and outreach are vital components of a long-term 15 protection and recovery strategy for the state.
- 16 (2) The legislature therefore declares that all young sport 17 fishers, and sport fishers of any age who wish to, should be educated 18 about identification of anadromous salmonid types, catch and release 19 techniques, spawning bed and stream bank identification and protection, 20 and the location and knowledge of fishing rules.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The definitions in this section apply throughout sections 2 and 3 of this act unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 24 (1) "Anadromous salmonid" and its derivatives means any of the 25 following types of fish: Salmon of any variety, steelhead trout, and 26 searun cutthroat trout.
- 27 (2) "To fish" and its derivatives means an effort to kill, injure, 28 harass, or catch a game fish.
- 29 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) All residents of this state under the age of eighteen shall carry with them, while fishing for anadromous 30 salmonids, a certification of completion of a state-approved course of 31 32 instruction of two to four hours addressing identification of salmon 33 types, catch and release techniques, spawning bed and stream bank identification and protection, and location and knowledge of fishing 34 35 laws and rules. Any nonresident of this state under the age of eighteen who wishes to fish for anadromous salmonids must either pass 36

- the examination established in this section or must be accompanied by someone who has passed the examination.
- 3 (2) The director shall establish a program for training persons in 4 the identification of:
 - (a) Salmon types;

- 6 (b) Catch and release reasoning, equipment, and techniques;
- 7 (c) Spawning bed and stream bank identification and protection; and
 - (d) The location and knowledge of fishing laws and rules.
- 9 (3) The training program is available to all people. The director shall establish an examination to be taken by those residents who have completed the instruction and by those nonresidents who wish to sport fish for anadromous salmonids in this state. A certificate of completion, which is required to be possessed by a sport fisher under age eighteen, shall only be issued upon the successful completion of the examination.
- (4) The director may cooperate with organized fishing or sporting groups and other public or private organizations in order to administer the program at the lowest possible cost. The director may apply for funding from alternate sources, both governmental and nongovernmental, in order to lower the cost of the program to the participants.
- (5) The director shall by rule prescribe the type of instruction and the qualifications of the instructors. The director shall authorize instructors of this program. Course materials should include color reference materials that are designed for easy field use.
- 25 (6) The director shall assess a fee on class participants as 26 necessary to cover the costs of administering the program.
 - (7) Upon successful completion of the course, which shall include a knowledge test and may, if feasible, include a skills test, a trainee shall receive a fisher education certificate signed by an authorized instructor. The certificate is evidence of compliance with this section.
- 32 (8) The director may accept certificates awarded by other states 33 that conduct substantially similar courses as evidence of compliance 34 with this section.
- (9) Every charter boat that offers anadromous salmonid fishing to the general public shall have at least one authorized instructor of the program created in this section on board at each sailing. That instructor shall directly oversee and participate in the fishing activity that occurs on the voyage.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Sections 2 and 3 of this act are each added
- 2 to chapter 77.12 RCW.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** If any provision of this act or its
- 4 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 5 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 6 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The sum of dollars, or as much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the general fund to
- 9 the department of fish and wildlife for the fiscal year ending June 30,
- 10 2000, to carry out the purposes of this act.
