- 1 AN ACT Relating to department of social and health services family
- 2 planning services; reenacting and amending RCW 74.09.510; and adding a
- 3 new section to chapter 74.09 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The department may, upon receipt of approval from the federal
- 8 health care financing administration, implement a waiver under section
- 9 1115 of the federal social security act to provide family planning
- 10 services to persons with family incomes at or below two hundred percent
- 11 of the federal poverty level. For purposes of this section, family
- 12 planning services includes all federal food and drug administration-
- 13 approved contraceptives, sterilization services, and medical services
- 14 associated with use of contraceptive and sterilization services,
- 15 educational services, social services, and interpretive services
- 16 necessary to aid individuals to avoid unintended pregnancy.
- 17 Sec. 2. RCW 74.09.510 and 1997 c 59 s 14 and 1997 c 58 s 201 are

18 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

p. 1 SB 5465

Medical assistance may be provided in accordance with eligibility 1 requirements established by the department, as defined in the social 2 3 security Title XIX state plan for mandatory categorically needy persons 4 and: (1) Individuals who would be eligible for cash assistance except for their institutional status; (2) individuals who are under twenty-5 one years of age, who would be eligible for temporary assistance for 6 needy families or medicaid, but do not qualify as dependent children 7 8 and who are in (a) foster care, (b) subsidized adoption, (c) a nursing 9 facility or an intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded, or 10 (d) inpatient psychiatric facilities; (3) the aged, blind, and disabled (a) Receive only a state supplement, or (b) would not be eligible 11 they were not institutionalized; (4) 12 for cash assistance if categorically eligible individuals who meet the income and resource 13 requirements of the cash assistance programs; (5) individuals who are 14 15 enrolled in managed health care systems, who have otherwise lost eligibility for medical assistance, but who have not completed a 16 17 current six-month enrollment in a managed health care system, and who are eligible for federal financial participation under Title XIX of the 18 19 social security act; (6) children and pregnant women allowed by federal 20 statute for whom funding is appropriated; (7) other individuals eligible for medical services under RCW 74.09.035 ((and)), 74.09.700, 21 and section 1 of this act for whom federal financial participation is 22 available under Title XIX of the social security act; and (8) persons 23 24 allowed by section 1931 of the social security act for whom funding is 25 appropriated.
