- AN ACT Relating to fireworks; amending RCW 70.77.270; providing an
- 2 effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.77.270 and 1997 c 182 s 8 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The governing body of a city or county, or a designee, shall
- 7 grant an application for a permit under RCW 70.77.260(1) if the
- 8 application meets the standards under this chapter, and the applicable
- 9 ordinances of the city or county. The permit shall be granted by June
- 10 10, or no less than thirty days after receipt of an application
- 11 whichever date occurs first, for sales commencing on June 28 and on
- 12 December 27; or by December 10, or no less than thirty days after
- 13 receipt of an application whichever date occurs first, for sales
- 14 commencing only on December 27.
- 15 (2) The chief of the Washington state patrol, through the director
- 16 of fire protection, shall prescribe ((uniform)) minimum, state-wide
- 17 standards for retail fireworks stands including, but not limited to,
- 18 the location of the stands, setback requirements and siting of the
- 19 stands, types of buildings and construction material that may be used

- 1 for the stands, use of the stands and areas around the stands, cleanup
- 2 of the area around the stands, transportation of fireworks to and from
- 3 the stands, and temporary storage of fireworks associated with the
- 4 retail fireworks stands. <u>However, tents, canopies, and temporary</u>
- 5 membrane materials may not be used for temporary fireworks stands, and
- 6 <u>customers may not be permitted in a temporary or permanent fireworks</u>
- 7 stand. All cities and counties which allow retail fireworks sales
- 8 shall comply with these standards.
- 9 (3) No retail fireworks permit may be issued to any applicant
- 10 unless the retail fireworks stand is covered by a liability insurance
- 11 policy with coverage of not less than fifty thousand dollars and five
- 12 hundred thousand dollars for bodily injury liability for each person
- 13 and occurrence, respectively, and not less than fifty thousand dollars
- 14 for property damage liability for each occurrence, unless such
- 15 insurance is not readily available from at least three approved
- 16 insurance companies. If insurance in this amount is not offered, each
- 17 fireworks permit shall be covered by a liability insurance policy in
- 18 the maximum amount offered by at least three different approved
- 19 insurance companies.
- No wholesaler may knowingly sell or supply fireworks to any retail
- 21 fireworks stand unless the wholesaler determines that the retail
- 22 fireworks stand is covered by liability insurance in the same amount as
- 23 provided in this subsection.
- 24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** If any provision of this act or its
- 25 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 26 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 27 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate
- 29 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 30 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 31 June 1, 1999.
