- 1 AN ACT Relating to the retention and promotion of students; and
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 28A.320 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.320 5 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The legislature finds that it is critical for the success of
- 7 the public school system and for the greatest achievement of each
- 8 individual pupil that all educators hold, and act upon, high
- 9 expectations for the academic achievement of every student. The
- 10 state's education reforms emphasize higher standards and performance,
- 11 not just "seat time" in school. No child should graduate from high
- 12 school with a diploma if the student is unable to read. Promoting
- 13 student from grade to grade without demonstrating appropriate
- 14 competencies does no service to our children.
- 15 (2) Beginning with the 1999-2000 school year, all school boards
- 16 shall adopt a policy, or amend any existing local policy, regarding
- 17 promotion and retention of pupils.
- 18 (3) The district policy shall be adopted at a public meeting of the
- 19 school board and shall:

- 1 (a) Provide for parental notification when a pupil is identified as 2 being at risk of retention. This notice shall be provided as early in 3 the school year, and as early in their school careers, as practicable. 4 The policy shall provide a pupil's parent or guardian the opportunity 5 to consult with the teacher or teachers responsible for the decision to 6 promote or retain the pupil; and
- 7 (b) Indicate the manner in which opportunities for remedial 8 instruction are available to pupils who are recommended for retention 9 or who are identified as being at risk for retention.
