- AN ACT Relating to class size reduction; amending RCW 28A.150.260
- 2 and 28A.150.260; making an appropriation; providing an effective date;
- 3 and providing a contingent effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.150.260 and 1997 c 13 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 The basic education allocation for each annual average full-time
- 8 equivalent student shall be determined in accordance with the following
- 9 procedures:
- 10 (1) The governor shall and the superintendent of public instruction
- 11 may recommend to the legislature a formula based on a ratio of students
- 12 to staff for the distribution of a basic education allocation for each
- 13 annual average full_time equivalent student enrolled in a common
- 14 school. The distribution formula shall have the primary objective of
- 15 equalizing educational opportunities and shall provide appropriate
- 16 recognition of the following costs among the various districts within
- 17 the state:
- (a) Certificated instructional staff and their related costs;
- 19 (b) Certificated administrative staff and their related costs;

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- 1 (c) Classified staff and their related costs;
 - (d) Nonsalary costs;

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- 3 (e) Extraordinary costs of remote and necessary schools and small 4 high schools, including costs of additional certificated and classified 5 staff; and
- 6 (f) The attendance of students pursuant to RCW 28A.335.160 and 7 28A.225.250 who do not reside within the servicing school district.
- 8 (2)(a) This formula for distribution of basic education funds shall 9 be reviewed biennially by the superintendent and governor. 10 recommended formula shall be subject to approval, amendment or The formula shall be for allocation rejection by the legislature. 11 purposes only. While the legislature intends that the allocations for 12 additional instructional staff be used to increase the ratio of such 13 14 staff to students, nothing in this section shall require districts to 15 reduce the number of administrative staff below existing levels.
- 16 (b) The formula adopted by the legislature shall reflect the 17 following ratios at a minimum:
- (i) Forty-nine certificated instructional staff to one thousand annual average full_time equivalent students enrolled in grades kindergarten through three;
- (ii) Forty-six certificated instructional staff to one thousand 21 annual average full_time equivalent students in grades four through 22 six. An additional maximum of four certificated 23 ((twelve)) 24 instructional staff per one thousand full-time equivalent students in grades four through six for the addition of teachers solely to reduce 25 class size. Any funds provided for these additional four certificated 26 instructional staff units shall not be considered basic education 27 funding and shall be allocated only if the district documents an actual 28 29 ratio equal to or greater than fifty certificated instructional staff 30 per thousand full-time equivalent students in grades four through six. For any school district documenting a lower certificated staff ratio, 31 the allocation shall be based on the higher of the district's actual 32 fourth through sixth grade ratio or forty-six certificated 33 34 instructional staff per thousand;
- (iii) Forty-six certificated instructional staff to one thousand annual average full-time equivalent students in grades seven through twelve;

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(iv) Four certificated administrative staff to one thousand annual average full_time equivalent students in grades kindergarten through twelve; and

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- $((\frac{\text{(iv)}}{\text{)}})$ <u>(v)</u> <u>S</u>ixteen and sixty-seven one-hundredths classified personnel to one thousand annual average full_time equivalent students enrolled in grades kindergarten through twelve.
- 7 (c) In the event the legislature rejects the distribution formula 8 recommended by the governor, without adopting a new distribution 9 formula, the distribution formula for the previous school year shall remain in effect: PROVIDED, That the distribution formula developed 10 pursuant to this section shall be for state apportionment and 11 equalization purposes only and shall not be construed as mandating 12 specific operational functions of local school districts other than 13 14 requirements identified in RCW 28A.150.220 those program and 15 28A.150.100. The enrollment of any district shall be the annual average number of full_time equivalent students and part_time students 16 as provided in RCW 28A.150.350, enrolled on the first school day of 17 18 each month and shall exclude full_time equivalent students with 19 disabilities recognized for the purposes of allocation of state funds for programs under RCW 28A.155.010 through 28A.155.100. The definition 20 of full_time equivalent student shall be determined by rules of the 21 22 superintendent of public instruction: PROVIDED, That the definition 23 shall be included as part of the superintendent's biennial budget 24 PROVIDED, FURTHER, That any revision of the present request: not take effect until approved by the house 25 definition shall 26 appropriations committee and the senate ways and means committee: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the office of financial management shall make 27 a monthly review of the superintendent's reported full_time equivalent 28 29 students in the common schools in conjunction with RCW 43.62.050.
 - (3)(a) Certificated instructional staff shall include those persons employed by a school district who are nonsupervisory employees within the meaning of RCW 41.59.020(8): PROVIDED, That in exceptional cases, people of unusual competence but without certification may teach students so long as a certificated person exercises general supervision: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the hiring of such classified people shall not occur during a labor dispute and such classified people shall not be hired to replace certificated employees during a labor dispute.

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- 1 (b) Certificated administrative staff shall include all those 2 persons who are chief executive officers, chief administrative 3 officers, confidential employees, supervisors, principals, or assistant 4 principals within the meaning of RCW 41.59.020(4).
- 5 (4) Each annual average full_time equivalent certificated classroom teacher's direct classroom contact hours shall average at least twenty-6 7 five hours per week. Direct classroom contact hours shall be exclusive 8 of time required to be spent for preparation, conferences, or any other 9 nonclassroom instruction duties. Up to two hundred minutes per week 10 may be deducted from the twenty-five contact hour requirement, at the discretion of the school district board of directors, to accommodate 11 authorized teacher/parent-guardian conferences, recess, passing time 12 between classes, and informal instructional activity. Implementing 13 rules to be adopted by the state board of education pursuant to RCW 14 15 28A.150.220(4) shall provide that compliance with the direct contact hour requirement shall be based upon teachers' normally assigned weekly 16 17 instructional schedules, as assigned by the district administration. Additional record-keeping by classroom teachers as a means 18 19 accounting for contact hours shall not be required. Waivers from 20 contact hours may be requested under RCW 28A.305.140.
- 21 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.150.260 and 1997 c 13 s 2 are each amended to read 22 as follows:
- 23 The basic education allocation for each annual average full_time 24 equivalent student shall be determined in accordance with the following 25 procedures:
 - (1) The governor shall and the superintendent of public instruction may recommend to the legislature a formula based on a ratio of students to staff for the distribution of a basic education allocation for each annual average full_time equivalent student enrolled in a common school. The distribution formula shall have the primary objective of equalizing educational opportunities and shall provide appropriate recognition of the following costs among the various districts within the state:
 - (a) Certificated instructional staff and their related costs;
 - (b) Certificated administrative staff and their related costs;

37 (d) Nonsalary costs;

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- 1 (e) Extraordinary costs of remote and necessary schools and small 2 high schools, including costs of additional certificated and classified 3 staff; and
- 4 (f) The attendance of students pursuant to RCW 28A.335.160 and 5 28A.225.250 who do not reside within the servicing school district.
- (2)(a) This formula for distribution of basic education funds shall 6 7 be reviewed biennially by the superintendent and governor. The 8 recommended formula shall be subject to approval, amendment or 9 rejection by the legislature. The formula shall be for allocation purposes only. While the legislature intends that the allocations for 10 additional instructional staff be used to increase the ratio of such 11 staff to students, nothing in this section shall require districts to 12 reduce the number of administrative staff below existing levels. 13
- 14 (b) The formula adopted by the legislature shall reflect the 15 following ratios at a minimum:
- 16 (i) Forty-nine certificated instructional staff to one thousand 17 annual average full_time equivalent students enrolled in grades 18 kindergarten through three;
- 19 (ii) Forty-six certificated instructional staff to one thousand 20 annual average full_time equivalent students in grades four through six. An additional maximum of four certificated 21 ((twelve)) instructional staff per one thousand full-time equivalent students in 22 grades four through six for the addition of teachers solely to reduce 23 24 class size. Any funds provided for these additional four certificated instructional staff units shall not be considered basic education 25 26 funding and shall be allocated only if the district documents an actual ratio equal to or greater than fifty certificated instructional staff 27 per thousand full-time equivalent students in grades four through six. 28 29 For any school district documenting a lower certificated staff ratio, 30 the allocation shall be based on the higher of the district's actual fourth through sixth grade ratio or forty-six certificated 31 instructional staff per thousand; 32
- (iii) Forty-six certificated instructional staff to one thousand
 annual average full-time equivalent students in grades seven through
 twelve;
- 36 <u>(iv)</u> Four certificated administrative staff to one thousand annual 37 average full_time equivalent students in grades kindergarten through 38 twelve; and

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(((iv))) <u>(v)</u> Sixteen and sixty-seven one-hundredths classified personnel to one thousand annual average full_time equivalent students enrolled in grades kindergarten through twelve.

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- 4 (c) In the event the legislature rejects the distribution formula recommended by the governor, without adopting a new distribution 5 6 formula, the distribution formula for the previous school year shall 7 remain in effect: PROVIDED, That the distribution formula developed 8 pursuant to this section shall be for state apportionment and 9 equalization purposes only and shall not be construed as mandating specific operational functions of local school districts other than 10 requirements identified in RCW 11 those program 28A.150.220 The enrollment of any district shall be the annual 12 28A.150.100. average number of full_time equivalent students and part_time students 13 14 as provided in RCW 28A.150.350, enrolled on the first school day of 15 each month and shall exclude full_time equivalent students with disabilities recognized for the purposes of allocation of state funds 16 for programs under RCW 28A.155.010 through 28A.155.100. The definition 17 of full_time equivalent student shall be determined by rules of the 18 19 superintendent of public instruction: PROVIDED, That the definition shall be included as part of the superintendent's biennial budget 20 PROVIDED, FURTHER, That any revision of the present 21 request: 22 definition shall not take effect until approved by the house appropriations committee and the senate ways and means committee: 23 24 PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the office of financial management shall make 25 a monthly review of the superintendent's reported full_time equivalent 26 students in the common schools in conjunction with RCW 43.62.050.
 - (3)(a) Certificated instructional staff shall include those persons employed by a school district who are nonsupervisory employees within the meaning of RCW 41.59.020(8): PROVIDED, That in exceptional cases, people of unusual competence but without certification may teach students so long as a certificated person exercises general supervision: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the hiring of such classified people shall not occur during a labor dispute and such classified people shall not be hired to replace certificated employees during a labor dispute.
- 36 (b) Certificated administrative staff shall include all those 37 persons who are chief executive officers, chief administrative 38 officers, confidential employees, supervisors, principals, or assistant 39 principals within the meaning of RCW 41.59.020(4).

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The sum of ninety-two million dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 2001, from the general fund to the office of the superintendent of public instruction for the purposes of this act.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Section 1 of this act takes effect September 6 1, 1999.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Section 2 of this act takes effect September
- 8 1, 2000. However, section 2 of this act shall not take effect if, by
- 9 September 1, 2000, a law is enacted stating that a school
- 10 accountability and academic assessment system is not in place.

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
