- 1 AN ACT Relating to child care for children in homeless families;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 74.13 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that: (1) Homeless 5 families with young children are at significant risk of being unable to 6 develop long-term economic independence; (2) children 7 situations are likely to experience immediate and future adverse consequences due to potential instability in their living arrangements 8 and lack of access to services; and (3) homeless families with young 9 children are inadequately served in terms of access to child care and 10 that such inadequacy acts to impair the abilities of these families to 11 12 locate housing, employment, and other basic family needs. 13 legislature intends to require the department of social and health 14 services to dedicate an effort to the development of a comprehensive, 15 research-based, integrated plan to expand the availability and delivery of child care services to homeless families with children. 16 The goals 17 of the plan shall be to increase the stability in the lives of families, offer safe and nurturing places for children, and provide 18 19 expanded opportunities for economic independence.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) For purposes of this section:
- 4 (a) "Homeless family" means a family with children when the family:
- 5 (i) On a regular basis, lacks an ongoing and identifiable place of
- 6 occupancy intended for humans for more than seven consecutive days; and
- 7 (ii) lacks the resources to obtain and remain in such a place of
- 8 occupancy; and

- 9 (b) "Child" or "children" means a child or children under the age 10 of ten years.
- (2) Not later than June 1, 2000, the secretary shall develop, and present to the legislature and governor, a plan for determining the need for child care services for children in homeless families and a
- 14 method for providing the child care services.
- 15 (3) The plan shall include the following, at a minimum:
- 16 (a) A determination, by age, of the number of children who are in 17 homeless families;
- 18 (b) A determination of the number of child care slots which are 19 dedicated to the children identified in this subsection;
- (c) A determination of how many child care slots in addition to 20 those identified in (b) of this subsection are necessary to be 21 dedicated to children in homeless families to reasonably assure that 22 any homeless family which seeks child care slots and lacks the 23 24 resources to obtain the slots can obtain state-supported child care 25 while they are homeless. The dedication of such slots shall not result 26 in the loss of any child care slots for which state support is 27 available;
- 28 (d) A cost estimate for providing the slots identified in (c) of 29 this subsection.
- 30 (4) The plan shall assume that children in homeless families are 31 not eligible to continue in child care slots dedicated for children in 32 homeless families longer than thirty calendar days following the date 33 the family is no longer homeless.
- 34 (5) The plan shall assume that children in homeless families are 35 not eligible to continue in child care slots dedicated for children in 36 homeless families longer than twelve consecutive months.

- 3 not later than June 30, 2002.
