- 1 AN ACT Relating to providing child day-care licensing information
- 2 to the public through a toll-free number; adding new sections to
- 3 chapter 74.15 RCW; and providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.15 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The legislature finds that consumers of child day-care centers and
- 8 family day-care providers have a legitimate interest in receiving
- 9 timely information about the providers of day-care services to enable
- 10 them to make meaningful choices regarding facilities and the people who
- 11 provide care for their children.
- 12 The legislature further finds that parents whose children are
- 13 consumers of day-care services are often unaware of the quality of the
- 14 facility or home they have chosen. This lack of knowledge is due, in
- 15 part, to the inability of parents to obtain such information. The
- 16 legislature intends to use the state's improved ability to collect and
- 17 manage information about day-care service providers by requiring that
- 18 all relevant licensing and enforcement action information be available

- 1 to parents and other appropriate persons as provided in section 2 of 2 this act.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 74.15 RCW 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (1) The department shall establish and maintain a toll-free 6 telephone number for the communication of information to the public 7 regarding child day-care centers and family day-care providers.
- 8 (2) The telephone number must be published in reasonably available 9 printed and electronic media and must be easily identifiable as a 10 number by which this information can be obtained. All licensed day11 care providers shall post the telephone number in a place and manner 12 clearly visible to consumers and the general public. If requested, a 13 day-care provider and the department shall provide the requestor with 14 the toll-free number.
 - (3) For purposes of this section, "communication of information" means callers may obtain the following information: (a) Whether a day-care center or family day-care provider is licensed; (b) whether a day-care center or family day-care provider is in good standing regarding licensing requirements; (c) whether a day-care center or family day-care provider is currently being investigated for either child abuse or neglect allegations or other licensing violations; (d) whether a day-care center or family day-care provider has ever been sanctioned for either child abuse or neglect findings or other licensing violations; (e) whether a day-care center or family day-care provider is currently or has been in the last three years on a corrective action plan as a result of either a child abuse or neglect finding or other licensing violation; (f) how to report suspected abuse or neglect or noncompliance with licensing standards; and (g) how to contact the office of the family and children's ombudsman.
- 30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act takes effect December 31, 2000.
