- AN ACT Relating to drivers' licenses; and amending RCW 46.20.100. 1
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 3 Sec. 1. RCW 46.20.100 and 1999 c 274 s 14 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- 5 (1) Application. The application of a person under the age of eighteen years for a driver's license or a motorcycle endorsement must
- be signed by a parent or quardian with custody of the minor.
- department of licensing must furnish a form that allows an adult to 8
- affirm in writing that he or she is the minor's parent or quardian with 9
- 10 custody. No other documentation or proof of the adult's status as the
- minor's parent or quardian is required. If the person under the age of 11
- eighteen has no father, mother, or guardian, then the application must 12

- 14 (2) Traffic safety education requirement. For a person under the

- 7 (b) To meet the traffic safety education requirement for a 8 motorcycle endorsement, the applicant must successfully complete a 9 motorcycle safety education course that meets the standards established 10 by the department of licensing.
- 11 (c) The department may waive the traffic safety education 12 requirement for a driver's license if the applicant demonstrates to the 13 department's satisfaction that:
- 14 (i) He or she was unable to take or complete a traffic safety 15 education course;
- 16 (ii) A need exists for the applicant to operate a motor vehicle; 17 and
- 18 (iii) He or she has the ability to operate a motor vehicle in such 19 a manner as not to jeopardize the safety of persons or property.
- 20 The department may adopt rules to implement this subsection (2)(c) in
- 21 concert with the supervisor of the traffic safety education section of

- 23 (d) The department may waive the traffic safety education 24 requirement if the applicant was licensed to drive a motor vehicle or 25 motorcycle outside this state and provides proof that he or she has had
