3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 The legislature finds that public health NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 5 hazards associated with environmental lead exposure represent a significant and preventable public health problem. Lead negatively б 7 affects every system of the body. It is harmful to individuals of all ages and is especially harmful to children, fetuses, and adults of 8 The effects of lead on a child's cognitive, 9 child-bearing age. 10 behavioral, and developmental abilities may necessitate large expenditures of public funds for health care and special education. 11 12 The irreversible damage to children and subsequent expenditures could 13 be avoided if exposure to lead is reduced.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The department of health is directed to implement a public health education program aimed at reducing childhood exposure to lead in residential settings. The program will continue the current efforts of the department to identify areas around the state where lead exposure poses a threat to children and families, and

1 will provide information, education, and training to areas of concern.
2 The program will especially focus on older housing stock, and the
3 residential hazards of lead-based paint. The department is directed to
4 seek federal funding for the lead hazards education project and to
5 operate it using these funds.
