- 1 AN ACT Relating to authorizing cost-reimbursement agreements for
- 2 leases and environmental permits; adding a new section to chapter
- 3 43.21A RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.30 RCW; adding a new
- 4 section to chapter 43.70 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.300
- 5 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 70.94 RCW; and creating new
- 6 sections.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** INTENT. It is the intent of the legislature
- 9 to allow the applicants of environmental permits for complex projects
- 10 to compensate permitting agencies for providing expedited environmental
- 11 review through the voluntary negotiation of cost-reimbursement
- 12 agreements with the permitting agency. It is the further intent of the
- 13 legislature that cost-reimbursement agreements for complex projects
- 14 free permitting agency resources to focus on and expedite the review of
- 15 small projects permits.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.21A RCW
- 17 to read as follows:

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- COST-REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY. (1) The department may enter into a written cost-reimbursement agreement with a permit applicant to recover from the applicant the reasonable costs incurred by the department in carrying out the requirements of this chapter, as well as the requirements of other relevant laws, as they relate to permit coordination, environmental review, application review, technical studies, and permit processing.
- (2) The written cost-reimbursement agreement shall be negotiated 8 9 with the permit applicant. The department may assign work to current 10 staff, temporary staff, or technical consultants in order to carry out 11 the work covered by the written cost-reimbursement agreement or the 12 work remaining for the department as a result of the permit review 13 process. The billing process shall provide for accurate time and cost accounting and may include a billing cycle that provides for progress 14 15 payments.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 43.30 RCW to read as follows:
- 18 COST-REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BY THEDEPARTMENT OF NATURAL 19 RESOURCES. (1) The department may enter into a written costreimbursement agreement with a permit or lease applicant to recover 20 from the applicant the reasonable costs incurred by the department in 21 carrying out the requirements of this chapter, as well as the 22 23 requirements of other relevant laws, as they relate to permit 24 coordination, environmental review, application review, technical 25 studies, and permit processing.
- 26 (2) The written cost-reimbursement agreement shall be negotiated 27 with the permit or lease applicant. The department may assign work to current staff, temporary staff, or technical consultants in order to 28 29 carry out the work covered by the written cost-reimbursement agreement or the work remaining for the department as a result of the permit, 30 environmental, or application review process. 31 The billing process shall provide for accurate time and cost accounting and may include a 32 billing cycle that provides for progress payments. 33
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 43.70 RCW to read as follows:
- 36 COST-REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. (1) The 37 department may enter into a written cost-reimbursement agreement with

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- a permit applicant to recover from the applicant the reasonable costs incurred by the department in carrying out the requirements of this chapter, as well as the requirements of other relevant laws, as they relate to permit coordination, environmental review, application review, technical studies, and permit processing.
- (2) The written cost-reimbursement agreement shall be negotiated 6 with the permit applicant. The department may assign work to current 7 8 staff, temporary staff, or technical consultants in order to carry out the work covered by the written cost-reimbursement agreement or the 9 10 work remaining for the department as a result of the permit review process. The billing process shall provide for accurate time and cost 11 12 accounting and may include a billing cycle that provides for progress 13 payments.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 43.300 RCW to read as follows:
- 16 COST-REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND 17 (1) The department may enter into a written cost-WILDLIFE. 18 reimbursement agreement with a permit applicant to recover from the 19 applicant the reasonable costs incurred by the department in carrying out the requirements of this chapter, as well as the requirements of 20 other relevant 21 laws, as they relate to permit coordination, 22 environmental review, application review, technical studies, and permit 23 processing.

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- (2) The written cost-reimbursement agreement shall be negotiated with the permit applicant. The department may assign work to current staff, temporary staff, or technical consultants in order to carry out the work covered by the written cost-reimbursement agreement or the work remaining for the department as a result of the permit review process. The billing process shall provide for accurate time and cost accounting and may include a billing cycle that provides for progress payments.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 70.94 RCW to read as follows:
- 34 COST-REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BY AN AIR POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY.
- 35 (1) An authority may enter into a written cost-reimbursement agreement
- 36 with a permit applicant to recover from the applicant the reasonable
- 37 costs incurred by the authority in carrying out the requirements of

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- this chapter, as well as the requirements of other relevant laws, as they relate to permit coordination, environmental review, application review, technical studies, and permit processing.
- 4 (2) The written cost-reimbursement agreement shall be negotiated 5 with the permit applicant. The authority may assign work to current 6 staff, temporary staff, or technical consultants in order to carry out 7 the work covered by the written cost-reimbursement agreement or the 8 work remaining for the authority as a result of the permit review 9 process. The billing process shall provide for accurate time and cost accounting and may include a billing cycle that provides for progress 11 payments.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. Captions used in this act are not any part of the law.

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
