- AN ACT Relating to exotic pets; creating a new section; making an
- 2 appropriation; and providing an expiration date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that many people
- 5 own and raise exotic pets in the state of Washington. The legislature 6 further finds that there are many issues surrounding exotic pets
 - further finds that there are many issues surrounding exotic pets
- 7 including but not limited to the educational value of diverse species,
- 8 health and safety concerns, and environmental issues. The legislature
- 9 further finds that legislation has been enacted in other states
- 10 regulating private citizens' possession of exotic pets. Since
- 11 legislation in other states may not fit the needs of Washington's
- 12 citizens, the legislature finds that a study about the issues of owning 13 and breeding exotic pets will help determine the best public policy in

- 14 Washington, balancing the best interests of all of the citizens.
- 15 (2) The department of agriculture shall appoint a task force to
- 16 study the issue of regulating exotic pets in the state of Washington.
- 17 The task force shall include but not be limited to representatives of
- 18 the department of agriculture, the department of fish and wildlife, the
- 19 department of health, and local government; owners and breeders of

- 1 exotic pets; pet stores; veterinarians; zoologists; zoo veterinarians;
- 2 animal control agencies; humane societies; and interested citizens.
- 3 The task force shall look at issues surrounding exotic pets including
- 4 but not limited to: The definition of exotic pets, the safety and
- 5 health of people, domestic animals and wildlife, the protection of
- 6 agriculture, the cost of regulating exotic pets, and the issue of
- 7 state-wide uniformity versus local control. By December 1, 2001, the
- 8 task force shall submit its recommendations, including any recommended
- 9 statutory or rule changes, to the committees in the senate and the
- 10 house of representatives having jurisdiction over agricultural issues.
- 11 (3) The following shall not be included in the study required in
- 12 this section: Llamas and alpacas; ratites including ostriches and emu;
- 13 American bison reared in captivity; and species of animals that have
- 14 been designated by rule as deleterious exotic wildlife by the
- 15 department of fish and wildlife.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act expires December 1, 2001.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The sum of forty-five thousand dollars, or
- 18 as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal
- 19 year ending June 30, 2001, from the general fund to the department of
- 20 agriculture for the purposes of this act.
