1 AN ACT Relating to personal information entered into the judicial
2 information system for purposes of issuing protection orders; and
3 amending RCW 26.50.160.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 26.50.160 and 1995 c 246 s 18 are each amended to read
6 as follows:

7 (1) To prevent the issuance of competing protection orders in
8 different courts and to give courts needed information for issuance of
9 orders, the judicial information system shall be available in each
10 district, municipal, and superior court by July 1, 1997, and shall
11 include a data base containing the following information:

12 ~~((1))~~ (a) The names of the parties and the cause number for every
13 order of protection issued under this title, every criminal no-contact
14 order issued under chapter 10.99 RCW, every antiharassment order issued
15 under chapter 10.14 RCW, every dissolution action under chapter 26.09
16 RCW, every third-party custody action under chapter 26.10 RCW, and
17 every parentage action under chapter 26.10 RCW;

1 ~~(3) Other relevant information necessary to assist courts in~~
2 ~~issuing orders under this chapter as determined by the judicial~~
3 ~~information system committee)) (c) The date of birth of the parties;~~

5 (d) The contact addresses of the parties. When collecting this
6 information, each party must be given notice that the contact address
7 becomes a public record and that the party may use an address other
8 than the party's personal residence. Addresses assigned through the
9 state's address confidentiality program under chapter 40.24 RCW may be
10 used for this purpose.

11 (2) In no case shall any other personally identifying information
12 be entered into the data base.

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
