- 1 AN ACT Relating to boarding homes; amending RCW 18.20.020,
- 2 18.20.040, 18.20.050, 18.20.110, 18.20.120, 18.20.130, and 18.20.190;
- 3 amending 1998 c 272 s 24 (uncodified); creating a new section;
- 4 repealing RCW 18.20.060 and 18.20.100; and providing an effective date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** It is the intent of the legislature that the
- 7 department of social and health services have the exclusive authority
- 8 to regulate and license boarding homes, except as specified in RCW
- 9 18.20.130.
- 10 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.20.020 and 1998 c 272 s 14 are each amended to read
- 11 as follows:
- 12 As used in this chapter:
- 13 (1) "Aged person" means a person of the age sixty-five years or
- 14 more, or a person of less than sixty-five years who by reason of
- 15 infirmity requires domiciliary care.
- 16 (2) "Boarding home" means any home or other institution, however
- 17 named, which is advertised, announced, or maintained for the express or
- 18 implied purpose of providing board and domiciliary care to ((three))

- 1 seven or more aged persons not related by blood or marriage to the
- 2 operator. ((It)) <u>However</u>, a boarding home that is licensed to provide
- 3 board and domiciliary care to three to six persons on the effective
- 4 date of this act may maintain its boarding home license as long as it
- 5 <u>is continually licensed as a boarding home. "Boarding home"</u> shall not
- 6 include facilities certified as group training homes pursuant to RCW
- 7 71A.22.040, nor any home, institution or section thereof which is
- 8 otherwise licensed and regulated under the provisions of state law
- 9 providing specifically for the licensing and regulation of such home,
- 10 institution or section thereof. Nor shall it include any independent
- 11 senior housing, independent living units in continuing care retirement
- 12 communities, or other similar living situations including those
- 13 subsidized by the department of housing and urban development.
- 14 (3) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, corporation,
- 15 company, association, or joint stock association, and the legal
- 16 successor thereof.
- 17 (4) "Secretary" means the secretary of social and health services.
- 18 (5) "Department" means the state department of social and health
- 19 services.
- 20 ((6) "Authorized department" means any city, county, city-county
- 21 health department or health district authorized by the secretary to
- 22 carry out the provisions of this chapter.))
- 23 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.20.040 and 1957 c 253 s 4 are each amended to read
- 24 as follows:
- 25 An application for a license shall be made to the department ((or
- 26 authorized department)) upon forms provided by ((either of said
- 27 departments)) the department and shall contain such information as the
- 28 department reasonably requires, which shall include affirmative
- 29 evidence of ability to comply with such rules ((and regulations)) as
- 30 are lawfully ((promulgated)) adopted by the ((board)) department.
- 31 **Sec. 4.** RCW 18.20.050 and 1987 c 75 s 3 are each amended to read
- 32 as follows:
- 33 Upon receipt of an application for license, if the applicant and
- 34 the boarding home facilities meet the requirements established under
- 35 this chapter, the department ((or the department and the authorized
- 36 health department jointly,)) shall issue a license. If there is a
- 37 failure to comply with the provisions of this chapter or the

standards((¬)) <u>and</u> rules((, and regulations promulgated)) <u>adopted</u> 1 pursuant thereto, the department((, or the department and authorized 2 health department,)) may in its discretion issue to an applicant for a 3 4 license, or for the renewal of a license, a provisional license which 5 will permit the operation of the boarding home for a period to be determined by the department, ((or the department and authorized health 6 7 department,)) but not to exceed twelve months, which provisional 8 license shall not be subject to renewal. At the time of the 9 application for or renewal of a license or provisional license the 10 licensee shall pay a license fee as established by the department under RCW 43.20B.110. ((When the license or provisional license is issued 11 jointly by the department and authorized health department, the license 12 13 fee shall be paid to the authorized health department.)) All licenses issued under the provisions of this chapter shall expire on a date to 14 15 be set by the department, but no license issued pursuant to this 16 chapter shall exceed twelve months in duration((: PROVIDED, That)). 17 However, when the annual license renewal date of a previously licensed boarding home is set by the department on a date less than twelve 18 19 months prior to the expiration date of a license in effect at the time 20 of reissuance, the license fee shall be prorated on a monthly basis and a credit be allowed at the first renewal of a license for any period of 21 one month or more covered by the previous license. All applications 22 23 for renewal of \underline{a} license shall be made not later than thirty days prior 24 to the date of expiration of the license. Each license shall be issued 25 only for the premises and persons named in the application, and no 26 license shall be transferable or assignable. Licenses shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the licensed premises. 27

28 **Sec. 5.** RCW 18.20.110 and 1985 c 213 s 7 are each amended to read 29 as follows:

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The department ((or authorized health department)) shall make or cause to be made at least a yearly inspection and investigation of all boarding homes. Every inspection shall focus primarily on actual or potential resident outcomes, and may include an inspection of every part of the premises and an examination of all records (other than financial records), methods of administration, the general and special dietary, and the stores and methods of supply. Following such an inspection or inspections, written notice of any violation of this law or the rules ((and regulations promulgated)) adopted hereunder((7))

- shall be given to the applicant or licensee and the department. 1 2 department may prescribe by ((regulations)) rule that any licensee or applicant desiring to make specified types of alterations or additions 3 4 to its facilities or to construct new facilities shall, before commencing such alteration, addition, or new construction, submit plans 5 and specifications therefor to the department ((or to the authorized 6 department)) of health for preliminary inspection and approval or 7 8 recommendations with respect to compliance with the ((regulations)) 9 rules and standards herein authorized.
- 10 **Sec. 6.** RCW 18.20.120 and 1994 c 214 s 25 are each amended to read 11 as follows:
- All information received by the department ((or authorized health department)) through filed reports, inspections, or as otherwise authorized under this chapter((-,)) shall not be disclosed publicly in any manner as to identify individuals or boarding homes, except at the specific request of a member of the public and disclosure is consistent with RCW 42.17.260(1).
- 18 **Sec. 7.** RCW 18.20.130 and 1995 c 369 s 4 are each amended to read 19 as follows:

20 Standards for fire protection and the enforcement thereof, with respect to all boarding homes to be licensed hereunder, shall be the 21 22 responsibility of the chief of the Washington state patrol, through the 23 director of fire protection, who shall adopt such recognized standards 24 as may be applicable to boarding homes for the protection of life 25 against the cause and spread of fire and fire hazards. The department, upon receipt of an application for a license, shall submit to the chief 26 27 of the Washington state patrol, through the director of 28 protection, in writing, a request for an inspection, giving the 29 applicant's name and the location of the premises to be licensed. Upon receipt of such a request, the chief of the Washington state patrol, 30 31 through the director of fire protection, or his or her deputy, shall 32 make an inspection of the boarding home to be licensed, and if it is 33 found that the premises do not comply with the required safety standards and fire ((regulations)) rules as ((promulgated)) adopted by 34 35 the chief of the Washington state patrol, through the director of fire protection, he or she shall promptly make a written report to the 36 37 boarding home and the department ((or authorized department)) as to the

manner and time allowed in which the premises must qualify for a 1 license and set forth the conditions to be remedied with respect to 2 fire ((regulations)) rules. The department, ((authorized department,)) 3 4 applicant, or licensee shall notify the chief of the Washington state 5 patrol, through the director of fire protection, upon completion of any requirements made by him or her, and the chief of the Washington state 6 patrol, through the director of fire protection, or his or her deputy, 7 8 shall make a reinspection of such premises. Whenever the boarding home 9 to be licensed meets with the approval of the chief of the Washington 10 state patrol, through the director of fire protection, he or she shall 11 submit to the department ((or authorized department,)) a written report 12 approving same with respect to fire protection before a full license 13 can be issued. The chief of the Washington state patrol, through the director of fire protection, shall make or cause to be made inspections 14 15 of such homes at least annually.

In cities which have in force a comprehensive building code, the provisions of which are determined by the chief of the Washington state patrol, through the director of fire protection, to be equal to the minimum standards of the code for boarding homes adopted by the chief of the Washington state patrol, through the director of fire protection, the chief of the fire department, provided the latter is a paid chief of a paid fire department, shall make the inspection with the chief of the Washington state patrol, through the director of fire protection, or his or her deputy, and they shall jointly approve the premises before a full license can be issued.

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- 26 **Sec. 8.** RCW 18.20.190 and 1998 c 272 s 15 are each amended to read 27 as follows:
- (1) The department of social and health services is authorized to take one or more of the actions listed in subsection (2) of this section in any case in which the department finds that a boarding home provider has:
- 32 (a) Failed or refused to comply with the requirements of this 33 chapter or the rules adopted under this chapter;
- (b) Operated a boarding home without a license or under a revoked license;
- 36 (c) Knowingly, or with reason to know, made a false statement of 37 material fact on his or her application for license or any data

- 1 attached thereto, or in any matter under investigation by the 2 department; or
- 3 (d) Willfully prevented or interfered with any inspection or 4 investigation by the department.
- 5 (2) When authorized by subsection (1) of this section, the 6 department may take one or more of the following actions:
 - (a) Refuse to issue a license;
- 8 (b) Impose reasonable conditions on a license, such as correction 9 within a specified time, training, and limits on the type of clients 10 the provider may admit or serve;
- 11 (c) Impose civil penalties of not more than one hundred dollars per 12 day per violation;
- 13 (d) Suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew a license; or
- 14 (e) Suspend admissions to the boarding home by imposing stop 15 placement.
- (3) When the department orders stop placement, the facility shall not admit any new resident until the stop placement order is terminated. The department may approve readmission of a resident to the facility from a hospital or nursing home during the stop placement.
- 20 The department shall terminate the stop placement when: (a) The
- 21 violations necessitating the stop placement have been corrected; and
- 22 (b) the provider exhibits the capacity to maintain adequate care and
- 23 service.

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- 24 (4) RCW 43.20A.205 governs notice of a license denial, revocation,
- 25 <u>suspension</u>, or modification. Chapter 34.05 RCW applies to department
- 26 actions under this section, except that orders of the department
- 27 imposing license suspension, stop placement, or conditions for
- 28 continuation of a license are effective immediately upon notice and
- 29 shall continue pending any hearing.
- 30 **Sec. 9.** 1998 c 272 s 24 (uncodified) is amended to read as 31 follows:
- 32 (1) Section((s)) 13 ((through 16)) of this act expires July 1,
- 32 (1) Section($(\frac{1}{8})$) 13 ($(\frac{1}{1} + \frac{1}{1} + \frac$
- 33 2000((, unless reauthorized by the legislature)).
- 34 (2) Section 17 of this act expires December 12, 1999.
