AN ACT Relating to independent commissions to set salaries for city and town mayors and councilmembers; amending RCW 35.22.200; adding a new section to chapter 35.21 RCW; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature hereby finds and declares 7 that:

8 (1) Article III, section 1 of the state Constitution permits 9 midterm salary increases for municipal officers who do not fix their 10 own compensation;

(2) The Washington citizens' commission on salaries for elected officials established pursuant to Article 28, section 1 of the state Constitution with voter approval has assured that the compensation for state and county elected officials will be fair and certain, while minimizing the dangers of midterm salary increases being used to influence those officers in the performance of their duties;

(3) The same public benefits of independent salary commissions
should be extended to the setting of compensation of municipal elected
officers; and

(4) This act is intended to clarify the intent of the legislature 1 2 that existing state law authorizes the establishment of independent salary commissions to set the salaries of mayors and councilmembers and 3 the authority of the voters of such cities and towns to review 4 5 commission decisions to increase or decrease such salaries by means of referendum. 6

7 Sec. 2. RCW 35.22.200 and 1965 ex.s. c 47 s 13 are each amended to read as follows: 8

9 The legislative powers of a charter city shall be vested in a mayor and a city council, to consist of such number of members and to have 10 such powers as may be provided for in its charter. The charter may 11 12 provide for direct legislation by the people through the initiative and referendum upon any matter within the scope of the powers, functions, 13 14 or duties of the city. The mayor and council and such other elective 15 officers as may be provided for in such charter shall be elected at such times and in such manner as provided in Title 29 RCW, and for such 16 terms and shall perform such duties ((and receive such compensation)) 17 18 as may be prescribed in the charter, and shall receive compensation in accordance with the process or standards of a charter provision or 19 ordinance which conforms with section 3 of this act. 20

21 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW 22 to read as follows:

23 (1) Salaries for mayors and councilmembers of towns and cities may 24 be set by mayor and council salary commissions established in 25 accordance with city charter or by ordinance and in conformity with this section. 26

27 (2) The members of such commissions:

28 (a) Shall be appointed by the mayor with approval of the city council; 29

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(b) May not be appointed to more than two terms;

(c) May only be removed during their terms of office for cause of 31 32 incapacity, incompetence, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office or 33 for a disqualifying change of residence; and

(d) May not include any officer, official, or employee of the city 34 35 or town or any of their immediate family members. "Immediate family member" as used in this subsection means the parents, spouse, siblings, 36 children, or dependent relatives of the officer, official, or employee, 37

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whether or not living in the household of the officer, official, or
 employee.

3 (3) Any change in salary shall be filed by the commission with the 4 city clerk and shall become effective and incorporated into the city or 5 town budget without further action of the city council or salary 6 commission.

7 (4) Salary increases established by the commission shall be
8 effective as to the mayor and all members of the city council,
9 regardless of their terms of office.

10 (5) Salary decreases established by the commission shall become 11 effective as to incumbent mayors and councilmembers at the commencement 12 of their next subsequent terms of office.

(6) Salary increases and decreases shall be subject to referendum petition by the people of the town or city in the same manner as a city ordinance upon filing of such petition with the city clerk within thirty days after filing of the salary schedule. In the event of the filing of a valid referendum petition, the salary increase or decrease shall not go into effect until approved by vote of the people.

(7) Referendum measures under this section shall be submitted to the voters of the city or town at the next following general or municipal election occurring thirty days or more after the petition is filed, and shall be otherwise governed by the provisions of the state Constitution, city charter, and laws generally applicable to referendum measures.

(8) The action fixing the salary of a city or town mayor or councilmember by a commission established in conformity with this section shall supersede any other provision of state statute or city or town ordinance related to municipal budgets or to the fixing of salaries of mayors and councilmembers.

30 (9) Salaries for mayors and councilmembers established under an 31 ordinance or charter provision in existence on the effective date of 32 this act that substantially comply with this section shall remain in 33 effect unless and until changed in accordance with such charter 34 provision or ordinance.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. If any provision of this act or its 36 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 37 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 38 persons or circumstances is not affected.

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1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. This act is necessary for the immediate 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 3 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 4 immediately.

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
