- 1 AN ACT Relating to a middle school after-school youth grant
- 2 program; adding a new section to chapter 28A.215 RCW; and creating a
- 3 new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that middle school
- 6 youth, grades six, seven, and eight, are experiencing remarkable
- 7 physical and emotional development. These changes often affect how
- 8 they perform in school and how they relate to parents and others in the
- 9 community. The legislature finds that adolescents enjoy excitement and
- 10 activities with peers. The legislature further finds that quality
- 11 programs organized by responsible adults will promote safety for
- 12 adolescents and the community.
- 13 The legislature further finds that there is a lack of affordable,
- 14 safe, age-appropriate child care opportunities for middle school youth.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.215
- 16 RCW to read as follows:

p. 1 SB 6501

- 1 (1) The superintendent of public instruction shall establish a 2 grant program to provide funding for after-school programs for middle 3 school youth. Under the grant program:
- 4 (a) Public schools and other public, private, and nonprofit 5 organizations may apply for grants to provide after-school programs to 6 youth in sixth, seventh, and eighth grades;
- 7 (b) Grants may be awarded to provide funding to either supplement 8 existing programs or start new programs;
- 9 (c) Applicants must provide twenty-five percent matching funds, 10 either money or in-kind;
- 11 (d) Preference is to be given to providing grants to programs that 12 will:
- 13 (i) Serve low-income youth;
- 14 (ii) Serve youth with special needs, including youth with 15 developmental or physical disabilities and youth in individualized 16 educational programs;
- 17 (iii) Serve economically depressed areas; and
- 18 (iv) Provide age-appropriate activities for the youth.
- 19 (2) In administering the grant program, the superintendent of 20 public instruction shall:
- (a) Establish an advisory board that includes representatives from middle schools, parents of middle school youth, and providers from community-based organizations and is geographically diverse. The advisory board shall review and rate applications prior to selection by the superintendent of public instruction;
- 26 (b) Develop outcome measures with input from the advisory board and 27 keep track of program impact using developmental assets as performance 28 measures; and
- 29 (c) Encourage participating organizations to participate in federal 30 food programs.
- 31 (3) The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules 32 under chapter 34.05 RCW setting forth criteria, application procedures, 33 and methods to implement this section.
