- 1 AN ACT Relating to housing assistance for school district
- 2 employees; adding a new section to chapter 43.185 RCW; creating new
- 3 sections; making an appropriation; and providing expiration dates.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the quality of education is improved when school district employees, including
- 7 teachers, other certificated staff, and classified employees, are able
- 8 to work and live in the same community. The legislature finds that
- 9 many school district employees cannot afford to live in the areas in
- 10 which they work making it more difficult for those employees to
- 11 maintain vital links with the school community including participation
- 12 in after school activities. Housing assistance for school district
- 13 employees would help school districts recruit and retain qualified
- 14 employees and improve the quality of education by helping those
- 15 employees to live in the same communities as do the students.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The department of community, trade, and
- 17 economic development, in cooperation with the housing finance
- 18 commission, shall establish a state-wide pilot program to provide down

- 1 payment assistance loans from the housing trust fund to eligible
- 2 employees of school districts. To be eligible, the employee's median
- 3 family income shall be less than one hundred percent of the area median
- 4 family income or the state median family income, whichever is higher,
- 5 and the loan shall be to purchase the employee's primary residence
- 6 located in the school district where the employee is employed.
- 7 (2) The department and the commission shall report to the
- 8 legislature by December 15, 2000, regarding the results of the program
- 9 including information about the number of borrowers assisted, the
- 10 average amount of the down payment assistance, and the number of loans
- 11 in each school district.
- 12 (3) This section expires June 30, 2002.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 43.185 RCW
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (1) The eligibility provisions of RCW 43.185.050 do not apply to
- 16 the pilot program in section 2 of this act.
- 17 (2) This section expires June 30, 2002.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The sum of five hundred thousand dollars, or
- 19 as much thereof may be necessary, is appropriated from the housing
- 20 trust fund to the department of community, trade, and economic
- 21 development for the biennium ending June 30, 2001, to be used by the
- 22 department of community, trade, and economic development to work in
- 23 cooperation with the housing finance commission to develop a state-wide
- 24 pilot program to provide down payment assistance loans to eligible
- 25 employees of school districts.
- 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Any funds from the appropriation in section
- 27 4 of this act which are held in escrow or as a guaranty or collateral
- 28 account and are remaining unexpended following the term of the loan
- 29 repayments under the pilot program established in section 2 of this
- 30 act, or at any prior time as determined by the housing finance
- 31 commission, shall be returned along with accrued interest to the state
- 32 general fund.
