- 10 <u>(a) W</u>orkers or other persons regularly employed on monthly or per 11 diem salary by the state, or any county, municipality, or political 12 subdivision created by its laws; or
- 13 <u>(b) Workers or other persons employed on federally funded projects</u>
 14 subject to the federal prevailing wage laws.
