SENATE BILL 6611

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the sale of antifreeze; adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 70.54 RCW; creating a new section; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that antifreeze
- 5 containing ethylene glycol poses a threat to the health and well-being
- 6 of children and animals. According to the American association of
- 7 poison control centers, about three thousand four hundred poisonings
- 8 related to ethylene glycol occur each year with about twenty percent of
- 9 these involving children under age six. The legislature further finds
- 10 that a phased-in ban on the use of ethylene glycol in antifreeze will
- 11 improve the general welfare of children and animals in the state.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 70.54 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (1) After January 1, 2001, an antifreeze product sold in this state
- 15 may not contain more than sixty-seven percent ethylene glycol.
- 16 (2) After January 1, 2003, an antifreeze product sold in this state
- 17 may not contain more than thirty-three percent ethylene glycol.

- 1 (3) After January 1, 2004, an antifreeze product sold in this state 2 may not contain ethylene glycol.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 70.54 RCW 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (1) The secretary of health is authorized to forbid the sale, and 6 order the removal from retail space, of any product the secretary 7 believes to be in violation of section 1 of this act.
- 8 (2) The secretary of health is authorized to adopt rules concerning 9 the sale of antifreeze products under this section and section 1 of 10 this act.
- 11 (3) A violation of this section or section 1 of this act, or the 12 rules adopted under this section or section 1 of this act, is a 13 misdemeanor.
