- 1 AN ACT Relating to a sales and use tax exemption for clothing and
- 2 footwear; adding a new section to chapter 82.08 RCW; and adding a new
- 3 section to chapter 82.12 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 82.08 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) For the period December 1st through December 7th, the tax
- 8 levied by RCW 82.08.020 does not apply to sales of clothing and
- 9 footwear for human use.
- 10 (2) The exemption under this section includes fabric, thread, yarn,
- 11 buttons, snaps, hooks, zippers, and other items used or consumed to
- 12 make or repair clothing if the item becomes a physical component part
- 13 of such clothing.
- 14 (3) The exemption under this section does not apply to costumes or
- 15 rented formal wear; items made from real or imitation pearls, precious
- 16 or semiprecious stones, jewels, or metals; athletic equipment; or
- 17 protective devices such as motorcycle helmets.
- 18 (4) The department may adopt rules to implement this section.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 82.12 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 (1) For the period December 1st through December 7th, the 4 provisions of this chapter do not apply with respect to the use of 5 clothing and footwear for human use.
- 6 (2) The exemption under this section includes fabric, thread, yarn,
  7 buttons, snaps, hooks, zippers, and other items used or consumed to
  8 make or repair clothing if the item becomes a physical component part
  9 of such clothing.
- 10 (3) The exemption under this section does not apply to costumes or 11 rented formal wear; items made from real or imitation pearls, precious 12 or semiprecious stones, jewels, or metals; athletic equipment; or 13 protective devices such as motorcycle helmets.
- 14 (4) The department may adopt rules to implement this section.

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
