## SENATE BILL 6637

## State of Washington 56th Legislature 2000 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to prevailing wages; amending RCW 39.12.020; and 2 creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 The legislature finds that funding for NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 5 common school construction, remodeling, and maintenance is scarce. The legislature also finds that taxpayers have strongly expressed their б 7 desire for frugal public spending. Yet laws requiring the payment of prevailing wages on public works and maintenance contracts force 8 pay more school 9 than they otherwise would for taxpayers to 10 construction, remodeling, and maintenance. Thus, the legislature intends to exempt public works and maintenance contracts of school 11 12 districts from prevailing wage requirements, and permit waqe 13 competition among firms seeking such contracts.

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 39.12.020 and 1989 c 12 s 7 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

16 The hourly wages to be paid to laborers, workers, or mechanics, 17 upon all public works and under all public building service maintenance 18 contracts of the state or any county, municipality or political

subdivision created by its laws, shall be not less than the prevailing 1 rate of wage for an hour's work in the same trade or occupation in the 2 locality within the state where such labor is performed. 3 For a 4 contract in excess of ten thousand dollars, a contractor required to pay the prevailing rate of wage shall post in a location readily 5 visible to workers at the job site: PROVIDED, 6 That on road construction, sewer line, pipeline, transmission line, street, or alley 7 8 improvement projects for which no field office is needed or 9 established, a contractor may post the prevailing rate of wage 10 statement at the contractor's local office, gravel crushing, concrete, or asphalt batch plant as long as the contractor provides a copy of the 11 wage statement to any employee on request: 12

(1) A copy of a statement of intent to pay prevailing wages
approved by the industrial statistician of the department of labor and
industries under RCW 39.12.040; and

(2) The address and telephone number of the industrial statistician
 of the department of labor and industries where a complaint or inquiry
 concerning prevailing wages may be made.

This chapter shall not apply to workers or other persons regularly employed on monthly or per diem salary by the state, or any county, municipality, or political subdivision created by its laws. <u>This</u> <u>chapter shall not apply to public works and public building service</u> <u>maintenance contracts of a school district, as defined in chapter</u> <u>28A.315 RCW, or an educational service district, as defined in chapter</u> <u>28A.310 RCW.</u>

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
