1 AN ACT Relating to schedules for the adoption or amendment of  
2 shoreline master programs; and amending RCW 90.58.080.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 90.58.080 and 1995 c 347 s 305 are each amended to  
5 read as follows:

6 (1) Local governments shall develop or amend(~~(, within twenty-four~~  
7 ~~months after the adoption of guidelines as provided in RCW 90.58.060,)~~)  
8 a master program for regulation of uses of the shorelines of the state  
9 consistent with the required elements of the guidelines adopted by the  
10 department within thirty-six months of receiving full funding from the  
11 legislature for such purpose.

12 (2) For guidelines adopted by the department before December 31,  
13 2000, consistent with the priority salmon recovery regions and water  
14 resource inventory areas map, as defined in the state-wide strategy to  
15 recover salmon, volume 1, page V.95, and population growth data  
16 provided by the office of financial management, King, Snohomish,  
17 Pierce, Clark, and Kitsap counties and the cities and towns therein  
18 with shorelines of the state, shall review master programs for  
19 compliance with the guidelines and adopt or amend as necessary within

1 thirty-six months. The requirements of this subsection (2) do not  
2 apply unless the legislature has appropriated funds for the purpose of  
3 updating local shoreline master programs and the counties and cities  
4 and towns therein have accepted grants from the state for such purpose.  
5 Ten percent of any funds appropriated to the department for the purpose  
6 of updating local shoreline master programs shall be made available by  
7 grant to other counties, cities, and towns with shorelines of the state  
8 who wish to revise master programs at the same time.

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
