- 1 AN ACT Relating to the official mammal of the state of Washington;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 1.20 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that the orca whale, Orcinus orca, also known as the killer whale, is a magnificent
- 6 free-roaming marine creature of the Pacific Northwest, and is an icon
- 7 of the marine ecosystem. The state of Washington has designated an
- 8 official state tree, grass, flower, fruit, bird, fossil, fish, insect,
- 9 song, folk song, and dance, but not an official state mammal. The orca
- 10 is an integral part of Northwest Indian tribal culture, and no living
- 11 creature would be more appropriate as an official state mammal than an
- 12 orca whale. Children of our state are keenly aware of the importance
- of the orca as a symbol of wildness and freedom. The legislature finds that the orca are state treasures, and are deserving of recognition as
- 15 the official state mammal.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 1.20 RCW
- 17 to read as follows:

- 1 The orca whale, Orcinus orca, is designated the official mammal of
- 2 the state of Washington.
