- AN ACT Relating to the omnibus credentialing act for counselors, 1 2 social workers, mental health counselors, and marriage and family 3 therapists; amending RCW 18.19.010, 18.19.020, 18.19.030, 18.19.090, 18.19.040, 18.19.050, 18.19.060, 18.19.070, 18.19.080, 18.19.100, 4 18.19.150, 18.19.160, 18.19.170, 18.19.180, 18.19.190, 5 18.19.140, 18.19.900, and 18.130.040; adding new sections to chapter 18.19 RCW; 6 7 creating a new section; and repealing RCW 18.19.110, 18.19.120, and 18.19.130. 8
- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 10 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.19.010 and 1987 c 512 s 1 are each amended to read 11 as follows:
- 12 (1) The qualifications and practices of counselors in this state 13 are virtually unknown to potential clients. Beyond the regulated practices of psychiatry and psychology, there are a considerable 14 15 variety of disciplines, theories, and techniques employed by other counselors under a number of differing titles. 16 The legislature recognizes the right of all counselors to practice their skills freely, 17 consistent with the requirements of the public health and safety, as 18 19 well as the right of individuals to choose which counselors best suit

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- their needs and purposes. This chapter shall not be construed to require or prohibit that individual or group policies or contracts of an insurance carrier, health care service contractor, or health maintenance organization provide benefits or coverage for services and supplies provided by a person registered or ((certified)) licensed under this chapter.
- 7 (2) There are three existing professional mental health professions 8 that have become valued disciplines within the larger scope of mental health practices over the past twenty-five years. These include social 9 work, mental health counseling, and marriage and family therapy. 10 Though these professions may use a variety of theoretical orientations, 11 they have demonstrated a comprehensive body of knowledge that can be 12 quantified and used as the basis for ethical practice. While all 13 14 counselors have the right to practice their skills freely, for a profession to become licensed, its practitioners must demonstrate 15 skills that are internally cohesive and successful in practice. Social 16 work, mental health counseling, and marriage and family therapy have 17 met these criteria. 18
- 19 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.19.020 and 1991 c 3 s 19 are each amended to read 20 as follows:
- ((Unless the context clearly requires otherwise,)) The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- (1) (("Certified marriage and family therapist" means a person certified to practice marriage and family therapy pursuant to RCW 18.19.130.
- 27 (2) "Certified mental health counselor" means a person certified to
 28 practice mental health counseling pursuant to RCW 18.19.120.
- (3) "Certified social worker" means a person certified to practice social work pursuant to RCW 18.19.110.)) "Approved clinical supervisor" means a licensed independent clinical social worker, licensed marriage and family therapist, or licensed mental health counselor, who has met the qualifications to be a clinical supervisor.
- 34 (2) "Approved social work program" means a school of social work or
 35 a social work educational program that has been accredited by the
 36 council on social work education, as determined by the secretary.
- 37 (3) "Case management" means the application of social work 38 knowledge including finding appropriate services, providing assistance

- with daily living tasks, assessing needs of clients in terms of service needs, and providing referrals to needed services.
- 3 (4) "Client" means an individual ((who)), couple, family, group,
 4 organization, or community that receives or participates in counseling
 5 or group counseling.

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- (5) "Clinical supervision" means a professional relationship between a supervisor and a social worker, marriage and family therapist, or mental health counselor that provides evaluation and direction to the supervisee and promotes continued development of the social worker's knowledge skills and abilities in master's, advanced, or clinical social work, marriage and family therapy, or mental health counseling.
- 13 (6) "Consultation" means problem solving in a process that offers
 14 social work expertise to an individual, couple, family, group,
 15 organization, or community.
- 16 <u>(7) "Continuing education" means education and training that will</u>
 17 <u>maintain, improve, or enhance social work knowledge and practice.</u>
- 18 (8) "Counseling" means licensed counseling as defined in subsection 19 (13) of this section or employing any therapeutic techniques, including 20 but not limited to social work, mental health counseling, marriage and family therapy, and hypnotherapy, for a fee that offer, assist or 21 attempt to assist an individual or individuals in the amelioration or 22 adjustment of mental, emotional, or behavioral problems, and includes 23 24 therapeutic techniques to achieve sensitivity and awareness of self and 25 others and the development of human potential. For the purposes of 26 this chapter, nothing may be construed to imply that the practice of 27 hypnotherapy is necessarily limited to counseling.
- $((\frac{(6)}{(6)}))$ <u>(9)</u> "Counselor" means an individual, practitioner, therapist, or analyst who engages in the practice of counseling to the public for a fee, including for the purposes of this chapter, hypnotherapists.
- $((\frac{7}{10}))$ <u>(10)</u> "Department" means the department of health.
- 33 (11) "Independent practice" means the practice of clinical social
 34 work, marriage and family therapy, and mental health counseling outside
 35 an organized setting, such as a social, governmental, or medical
 36 agency, in which a clinical social worker, marriage and family
 37 therapist, and mental health counselor assumes responsibility and
 38 accountability for services provided.

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- 1 (12) "Licensed advanced social worker" means a person licensed to 2 practice advanced social work under this chapter.
- 3 (13) "Licensed counseling" means the application of social work, 4 marriage and family therapy, or mental health counseling knowledge to 5 a client with problems in relationships or with the environment through 6 a supportive relationship, providing advice, and techniques that help 7 a client to cope with current life stresses.
- 8 (14) "Licensed independent clinical social worker" means a person
 9 licensed to practice independent clinical social work under this
 10 chapter.
- 11 <u>(15) "Licensed marriage and family therapist" means a person</u>
 12 licensed to practice marriage and family therapy under this chapter.
- 13 (16) "Licensed mental health counselor" means a person licensed to 14 practice mental health counseling under this chapter.
- 15 <u>(17) "Licensed social worker" means a person licensed to practice</u> 16 master's level social work under this chapter.
- 17 (18) "Mental health advisory committee" means the advisory
 18 committee created under this chapter to advise the secretary on
 19 disciplinary matters, continuing education, scope of practice issues,
 20 and any other matters related to the professions of social work,
 21 marriage and family therapy, and mental health counseling.
 - (19) "Mental health counseling" means the application of principles of human development, learning theory, group dynamics, and etiology of mental illness and dysfunctional behavior to individuals, couples, families, groups, and organizations, for the purpose of treating mental disorders and promoting optimal mental health and functionality. It includes, but is not limited to, the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of mental and emotional disorders, as well as the application of a wellness model of mental health.
- 30 (20) "Psychotherapy" means the diagnosis and treatment of emotional disorders through the utilization of specialized formal interaction 31 between a clinical social worker, a marriage and family therapist, or 32 a mental health counselor, and a client. It includes a therapeutic 33 34 relationship that is established, maintained, and sustained through attention to conscious and unconscious processes in the treatment of 35 psychosocial disorders, emotional disorders, behavioral disorders, 36 37 addictive disorders, and interpersonal disorders.
- 38 $((\frac{(8)}{)})$ (21) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department or 39 the secretary's designee.

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REGISTRATION OF COUNSELORS

- 3 Sec. 3. RCW 18.19.030 and 1991 c 3 s 20 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- No person may, for a fee or as a part of his or her position as an employee of a state agency, practice counseling without being registered to practice by the department under this chapter unless exempt under RCW 18.19.040. ((No person may represent himself or herself as a certified social worker, certified mental health
- 10 counselor, or certified marriage and family therapist without being so
- 11 certified by the department under this chapter.))
- 12 **Sec. 4.** RCW 18.19.090 and 1991 c 3 s 24 are each amended to read 13 as follows:
- 14 The secretary shall issue a registration to any applicant who 15 submits, on forms provided by the secretary, the applicant's name, address, occupational title, name and location of business, and other 16 17 information as determined by the secretary, including information 18 necessary to determine whether there are grounds for denial of registration or issuance of a conditional registration under this 19 chapter or chapter 18.130 RCW. Applicants for registration shall 20 21 register as counselors or may register as hypnotherapists if employing 22 hypnosis as a modality. Applicants shall, in addition, provide in 23 their titles a description of their therapeutic orientation, 24 discipline, theory, or technique. Each applicant shall pay a fee determined by the secretary as provided in RCW 43.70.250, which 25 ((shall)) must accompany the application. 26

27 PART TWO

28 LICENSED SOCIAL WORK

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The legislature finds that the practice of social work affects the public health, safety, and welfare, and that
- 31 only qualified persons should be permitted to engage in the practice.
- 32 The legislature declares that the licensure of social work practice by
- 33 the state is in the public interest.

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- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** (1) No person may represent himself or
- 2 herself as a licensed social worker, licensed advanced social worker,
- 3 or licensed independent clinical social worker without being licensed
- 4 by the department under this chapter unless exempted by this chapter.
- 5 (2) No public employee may represent himself or herself as a social
- 6 worker, advanced social worker, or independent clinical social worker
- 7 without holding a baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degree from an
- 8 educational program in social work approved by the secretary.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** The secretary shall issue a license to
- 10 practice social work, advanced social work, or independent clinical
- 11 social work to an applicant who demonstrates to the secretary's
- 12 satisfaction that the following requirements have been met:
- 13 (1) For a license to practice social work, the qualifications are:
- 14 (a) Graduation from a master's level educational program approved
- 15 by the secretary; and
- 16 (b) Successful completion of an approved examination.
- 17 (2) For a license to practice advanced social work, the
- 18 qualifications are:
- 19 (a) Graduation from a master's or doctorate educational program
- 20 approved by the secretary; and
- 21 (b) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement.
- 22 The experience requirement consists of a minimum of three thousand two
- 23 hundred hours of experience over a two-year period as a licensed social
- 24 worker, with supervision by a licensed clinical social worker of at
- 25 least ninety hours. Of the total supervision, fifty hours must be in
- 26 individual face-to-face supervision by a licensed advanced social
- 27 worker, and forty hours of supervision may be with another qualified
- 28 mental health professional. Distance supervision may be obtained for
- 29 no more than forty hours supervision.
- 30 (3) For a license to practice independent clinical social work, the
- 31 qualifications are:
- 32 (a) Graduation from a master's or doctorate level educational
- 33 program approved by the secretary;
- 34 (b) Successful completion of an approved examination; and
- 35 (c) Successful completion of a supervised experience requirement.
- 36 The experience requirement consists of a minimum of four thousand hours
- 37 of experience over a three-year period as a licensed social worker or
- 38 licensed advanced social worker with supervision by a licensed

- 1 independent clinical social worker, with at least one hundred thirty
- 2 hours in individual supervision. Of total supervision, seventy hours
- 3 must be face-to-face supervision with a licensed advanced social
- 4 worker, and sixty hours may be supervised by another qualified mental
- 5 health professional. Distance supervision may be obtained for no more
- 6 than sixty hours.
- 7 (4) Until twenty-four months after the effective date of this act,
- 8 the secretary shall waive the examination and issue a license to
- 9 practice.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** (1) The practice of licensed social work
- 11 includes the knowledge and application of social work theory, methods,
- 12 and ethics, including emotional assessment, case management,
- 13 consultation, advocacy, counseling, and community organization.
- 14 (2) The practice of licensed advanced social work is a specialty
- 15 which requires the knowledge and application of social work theory,
- 16 methods, and ethics to individuals, couples, families, groups,
- 17 organizations, and communities, and includes the ability to assess,
- 18 develop, and implement treatment plans in the areas of counseling for
- 19 emotional disorders, family systems, prevention, and psychosocial
- 20 assessment. It also includes administration, policy development,
- 21 school social work, medical social work, case management,
- 22 organizational consultation, teaching, and research. Advanced social
- 23 work involves the use of independent judgment, but does not include the
- 24 independent practice of psychotherapy. Advanced social work practice
- 25 that includes psychotherapy must be practiced under the supervision of
- 26 a licensed independent clinical social worker. Other types of advanced
- 27 social work may be practiced under the supervision of a licensed
- 28 advanced social worker. Advanced social work is practiced in agency
- 29 and organizational settings such as hospitals, community mental health
- 30 agencies, schools, and other locales.
- 31 (3) The practice of licensed independent clinical social work is a
- 32 specialty which requires the knowledge and application of social
- 33 theory, methods, and ethics to individuals, couples, families, groups,
- 34 organizations, and communities, and includes the ability to work
- 35 independently with vulnerable clients to diagnose emotional disorders
- 36 and treat disorders through psychotherapy, as well as assessment,
- 37 consultation, supervision, and prevention. It requires clinical skills
- 38 to restore, improve, or enhance emotional, cognitive, or social

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- 1 functioning. It is practiced with diagnostic assessment and treatment
- 2 tools and the use of theory bases that may be psychodynamic, cognitive
- 3 behavioral, family therapeutic, case management, biopsychosocial, and
- 4 other established theory bases, including the functions of a licensed
- 5 advanced social worker.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** A social worker licensed under this chapter
- 7 shall biennially attend at least thirty-six hours of continuing
- 8 education in curricula approved by the secretary as a condition of
- 9 license renewal, of which six hours must be devoted to professional law
- 10 and ethics. In approving the curricula, the secretary shall consider
- 11 the educational and training standards of nationally recognized
- 12 professional organizations of social work, mental health counseling,
- 13 and marriage and family counseling and accredited schools offering
- 14 graduate degrees in these programs in the state of Washington.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** In addition to acts of unprofessional
- 16 conduct specified in RCW 18.130.180, a social worker licensed under
- 17 this chapter committing the following acts of unethical conduct is
- 18 subject to the disciplinary process and sanctions under the uniform
- 19 disciplinary act, chapter 18.130 RCW.
- 20 (1) A licensee shall not engage in sexual relations with a past,
- 21 present, or future client who has been, or is, in a counseling or
- 22 therapeutic relationship with the licensee.
- 23 (2) A licensee shall not charge a client in a professional
- 24 relationship a fee higher than the usual and customary fees recognized
- 25 by the profession, as determined by the secretary, or otherwise profit
- 26 from the professional relationship.
- 27 (3) A licensee shall not diagnose or treat a relative or other
- 28 person who has a social relationship with the licensee.
- 29 (4) A licensee shall not have a business relationship outside the
- 30 counseling or psychotherapeutic relationship with his or her client
- 31 during the counseling or psychotherapy and for at least two years after
- 32 the end of the counseling or psychotherapy.
- 33 <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **Sec. 11.** A social worker licensed for independent
- 34 clinical social work for a period of at least two years may supervise
- 35 social work practice. A social worker licensed for advanced social
- 36 work for at least two years may supervise licensed social work.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 12. (1) A social worker certified pursuant to this chapter to practice social work for at least two years before the effective date of this act is eligible for a license as an independent clinical social worker, and upon application the secretary shall issue the license.
- 6 (2) An uncertified social worker meeting the requirements for 7 licensure as an advanced social worker or independent clinical social 8 worker is eligible, upon application to the secretary, for a license to 9 practice as an advanced social worker or independent clinical social 10 worker for two years following the effective date of this act.
- 11 (3) An uncertified social worker meeting partial requirements for 12 licensure under this chapter may have up to two years from the 13 effective date of this act to complete the qualifications for 14 licensure.
- 15 (4) An uncertified social worker may have up to three years from 16 the effective date of this act to meet the qualifications for licensure 17 under this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 13. The confidentiality standard for supervised licensed social workers, licensed advanced social workers, and licensed independent social workers who are working with clients practicing counseling or psychotherapy are privileged. All other functions of social work practice have the same standard of confidentiality.

23 PART THREE

24 LICENSED MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 14. No person may represent himself or herself as a licensed mental health counselor without holding a license issued by the department under this chapter unless exempted under this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 15. (1) The secretary shall issue a license to practice mental health counseling to any applicant who demonstrates to the secretary's satisfaction that the education and experience requirements for licensing have been met. Applications for licensing must be submitted on forms provided by the secretary. The secretary may require any information and documentation which reasonably relates to the need to determine whether the applicant meets the criteria for

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- 1 a license provided for in this chapter and chapter 18.130 RCW. Each
- 2 applicant shall pay a fee determined by the secretary under RCW
- 3 43.70.250. The fee must accompany the application.
- 4 (2) An applicant for a license must:
- 5 (a) Provide official transcripts documenting the applicant's
- 6 completion of a master's or doctoral degree in mental health counseling
- 7 or a related discipline from a college or university accredited by a
- 8 regional accrediting agency;
- 9 (b) Successfully complete a written examination on knowledge and
- 10 application of mental health counseling which has been approved by the
- 11 department for mental health counselors;
- 12 (c) Successfully complete thirty-six months or three thousand hours
- 13 of postgraduate mental health counseling experience under supervision
- 14 of a qualified mental health professional; and
- 15 (d) Provide three letters of reference from health or mental health
- 16 practitioners attesting to the applicant's character and professional
- 17 integrity.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 16.** The applicant must demonstrate to the
- 19 satisfaction of the secretary that the three thousand hours of required
- 20 experience:
- 21 (1) Were performed under the general supervision of a qualified
- 22 mental health professional who either meets or exceeds the standards of
- 23 a licensed mental health counselor;
- 24 (2) Included a minimum of one hundred hours spent in immediate
- 25 supervision with the qualified mental health professional; and
- 26 (3) Included a minimum of one thousand two hundred hours of direct
- 27 counseling with individuals, couples, families, or groups.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 17. (1) A mental health counselor certified
- 29 pursuant to this chapter to practice mental health counseling for at
- 30 least two years before the effective date of this act is eligible for
- 31 a license as a mental health counselor, and upon application the
- 32 secretary shall issue the license.
- 33 (2) An uncertified mental health counselor meeting the requirements
- 34 for mental health counselor licensure is eligible, upon application to
- 35 the secretary, for a license to practice as a mental health counselor
- 36 for two years following the effective date of this act.

- 1 (3) An uncertified mental health counselor meeting partial 2 requirements for licensure under this chapter may have up to two years 3 from the effective date of this act to complete the qualifications for 4 licensure.
- 5 (4) An uncertified mental health counselor may have up to three 6 years from the effective date of this act to meet the qualifications 7 for licensure under this chapter.

8 PART FOUR

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MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPISTS

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 18. (1) No person may represent himself or herself as a licensed marriage and family therapist, or use any title or description of services, without applying for licensure, meeting the required qualifications, and being licensed by the department under this chapter, unless otherwise exempted by this chapter.
- (2) The practice of marriage and family therapy means the rendering 15 of professional marriage and family therapy services to individuals, 16 17 couples, and families, singly or in groups, whether such services are 18 offered directly to the general public or through organizations, either public or private, for a fee, monetary or otherwise. "Marriage and 19 family therapy" means the diagnosis and treatment of mental and 20 21 emotional disorders, whether cognitive, affective, or behavioral, 22 within the context of marriage and family systems. Marriage and family 23 therapy involves the professional application of psychotherapeutic and 24 family systems theories and techniques in the delivery of services to 25 individuals, couples, and families for the purpose of treating diagnosed nervous and mental disorders. 26
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 19.** (1) The secretary shall issue a license to any applicant who demonstrates to the secretary's satisfaction that the following requirements have been met:
- 30 (a) Graduation from a master's degree or doctoral degree 31 educational program in marriage and family therapy approved by the 32 secretary, or from a graduate degree educational program in an allied 33 field equivalent to a master's degree in marriage and family therapy 34 approved by the secretary;
- 35 (b) Successful completion of work experience equal to at least two 36 calendar years in marriage and family therapy under qualified

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- 1 supervision after graduation. "Qualified supervision" means the
- 2 supervision of clinical services by an approved supervisor in
- 3 accordance with standards approved by the secretary in consultation
- 4 with the advisory committee. Clinical membership in a nationally
- 5 recognized marriage and family therapy organization is deemed to meet
- 6 the educational and experience qualifications for licensure provided
- 7 under (a) and (b) of this subsection; and
- 8 (c) Successful completion of an approved examination.
- 9 (2) Applicants are subject to the grounds for denial of a license 10 or temporary permit under chapter 18.130 RCW.
- 11 (3) The secretary shall issue a license to any applicant who is
- 12 certified to practice marriage and family therapy by the department on
- 13 the effective date of this act.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 20.** The secretary is authorized to issue a
- 15 temporary permit to an applicant to practice marriage and family
- 16 therapy for up to one year while the application for examination is
- 17 being processed, pending the taking of the examination and the receipt
- 18 of the results.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 21.** If both parties to a marriage have obtained
- 20 marriage and family therapy by the same licensed marriage and family
- 21 therapist, the therapist may not testify in an alimony or divorce
- 22 action concerning information acquired in the course of the therapeutic
- 23 relationship. The therapist is otherwise competent to testify in
- 24 custody actions.
- 25 PART FIVE
- 26 COMMON ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS FOR LICENSED SOCIAL WORK,
- 27 MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING, AND MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 22. The secretary shall establish by rule the
- 29 procedural requirements and fees for license renewal. Failure to renew
- 30 invalidates the license and all privileges granted by the license. If
- 31 a license has lapsed for a period longer than three years, the
- 32 individual must demonstrate competence to the satisfaction of the
- 33 secretary by taking continuing education courses or meeting other
- 34 standards determined by the secretary.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 23. (1) A person licensed under this chapter to 1 2 practice social work, mental health counseling, or marriage and family therapy must provide clients at the commencement of any program of 3 4 treatment with accurate disclosure information concerning the practice, 5 in accordance with rules adopted by the secretary, including the right of clients to refuse treatment, the responsibility of clients to choose 6 the provider and treatment modality which best suits their needs, and 7 8 the extent of confidentiality provided by this chapter. The disclosure 9 information must also include the license holder's professional education and training, the therapeutic orientation of the practice, 10 the proposed course of treatment where known, financial requirements, 11 12 and such other information as required by rule. The disclosure must be 13 acknowledged in writing by the client and license holder.
- 14 (2) The secretary, in consultation with the board, may adopt rules 15 implementing this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 24. (1) The communication of a client in a treatment relationship with a person licensed under this chapter is considered confidential health care information and shall not be disclosed except as authorized pursuant to chapter 70.02 RCW.
- 20 (2) Confidential health care information is privileged against 21 public disclosure to the same extent and subject to the same conditions 22 as communications between an attorney and client under RCW 5.60.060.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 25. An applicant holding a credential in another state to practice social work, mental health counseling, or marriage and family therapy may be licensed to practice in this state without examination if the secretary determines that the other state's credentialing standards are substantially equivalent to the licensing standards in this state.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 26. The uniform disciplinary act, chapter 18.130 RCW, governs the issuance and denial of a license, unauthorized practice, and the discipline of persons licensed under this chapter.
- 32 **Sec. 27.** RCW 18.19.040 and 1987 c 512 s 4 are each amended to read 33 as follows:
- Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prohibit or restrict:

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- 1 (1) The practice of a profession by a person who is either 2 registered, certified, licensed, or similarly regulated under the laws 3 of this state and who is performing services within the person's 4 authorized scope of practice, including any attorney admitted to 5 practice law in this state when providing counseling incidental to and 6 in the course of providing legal counsel;
