- 1 AN ACT Relating to local government expenditures; and adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 43.135 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.135 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) A political subdivision of the state shall not expend from its 7 general expense budget during any fiscal year moneys in excess of the
- 8 local expenditure limit established under this section and section 2 of
- 9 this act.
- 10 (2) A political subdivision shall not issue or redeem any check,
- 11 warrant, or voucher that will result in an expenditure for any fiscal
- 12 year in excess of the local expenditure limit established under this
- 13 section and section 2 of this act.
- 14 (3) The political subdivision's expenditure limit for any fiscal
- 15 year shall be the previous fiscal year's expenditure limit increased by
- 16 a percentage rate that equals the previous year's local fiscal growth
- 17 factor.
- 18 (4) For purposes of computing the local expenditure limit for the
- 19 fiscal year beginning January 1, 2001, the phrase "the previous fiscal

- 1 year's local expenditure limit" means the total expenditures from the
- 2 general expense budget, not including federal funds, for the fiscal
- 3 year beginning January 1, 2000, plus the local fiscal growth factor for
- 4 fiscal year beginning January 1, 1999.
- 5 (5) Each November, the political subdivision shall adjust the local
- 6 expenditure limit by the local fiscal growth factor for the preceding
- 7 fiscal year and then project an expenditure limit for the next two
- 8 fiscal years.
- 9 (6) "Local fiscal growth factor" means the sum of inflation and a
- 10 percentage equal to the ratio that the increase in the assessed value
- 11 in the taxing district resulting from new construction and improvements
- 12 to property under chapter 84.55 RCW bears to the total assessed value
- 13 for the political subdivision for the previous year.
- 14 (7) "Inflation" means the percentage change in the implicit price
- 15 deflator for the United States as published by the federal bureau of
- 16 labor statistics.
- 17 (8) "Political subdivision" means every county, city, town, and
- 18 special purpose district of the state.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.135 RCW
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (1) After January 1, 2001, a political subdivision may exceed the
- 22 local expenditure limit if:
- 23 (a) The expenditure has been approved by a majority of the voters
- 24 of the political subdivision; or
- 25 (b) The legislative authority of the political subdivision has
- 26 declared an emergency by a two-thirds vote of the legislative
- 27 authority. The authority to expend in excess of the local expenditure
- 28 limit under this subsection (1)(b) expires sixty days following the
- 29 next general election unless the authority has been approved under (a)
- 30 of this subsection.
- 31 (2) Any ballot measure submitted to the voters under subsection (1)
- 32 of this section shall state the proposed percentage increase in
- 33 expenditures and the duration of the authority.
- 34 (3) If the cost of any local program or function is shifted from
- 35 the general expense budget on or after January 1, 2000, to another
- 36 source of funding, or if moneys are transferred from the general

- 1 expense budget to another fund or account, the political subdivision
- 2 shall lower the local expenditure limit to reflect the shift.
