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SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8428

State of Washington 56th Legislature 2000 Regular Session

WHEREAS, Washington state trade missions play a vital and important role in the state's economic development, promoting the growth of

businesses and agriculture, and resulting in job creation; and

WHEREAS, The participation of Washington state legislators in trade missions is crucial to the success of fostering strong relations with the state's trading partners and of creating new trade opportunities

7 for businesses in Washington state; and

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WHEREAS, The participation of Washington state legislators in trade missions enables the legislature to craft legislation which better addresses trade and fosters better understanding between the people of Washington state and the people of other nations; and

12 WHEREAS, The involvement of Washington state legislators in trade 13 missions should be governed by protocols adopted by the legislature;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That the following protocols for legislative participation in executive agency trade missions be established; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That state trade missions will be initiated and organized by the executive of the agency, which includes the Office of the Governor; and

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- 1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the executive agency organizing the
- 2 trade mission will inform both houses of the legislature of forthcoming
- 3 missions in a timely manner. In its official notice to the
- 4 legislature, the executive agency shall be responsible for providing
- 5 the following information:
- 6 (1) A statement of trade mission objectives, dates, and expected 7 itinerary; and
- 8 (2) A description of the type of knowledge, background, and
- 9 experience held by a delegation member which might provide assistance
- 10 to the trade mission; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the agency may request that one of the
- 12 participating legislators serve as designated leader of the trade
- 13 mission; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That at least one or more legislators from
- 15 each caucus of the Senate and the House of Representatives may
- 16 participate in the trade mission, depending on the size and scope of
- 17 the mission. The agency will be notified of the legislative
- 18 participants in a timely manner; and
- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That whenever possible, legislators
- 20 possessing business, foreign market, language, cultural expertise, or
- 21 an interest pertinent to the trade mission are encouraged to
- 22 participate; and
- 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That each legislative participant is
- 24 responsible for assisting the trade mission achieve its stated goals
- 25 and objectives; and
- 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the designated leader of the trade
- 27 mission will work closely with agency staff to develop the trade
- 28 mission protocols and responsibilities and define the working
- 29 relationship with agency staff; and
- 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That following completion of the trade
- 31 mission, upon request, each legislative participant is encouraged to
- 32 provide feedback concerning the mission and its results to the agency
- 33 in a timely manner; and
- 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That nothing in this resolution precludes
- 35 members of the legislature from participating in the mission.

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
