- AN ACT Relating to higher education; amending RCW 28B.10.800,
- 2 28B.10.804, 28B.10.806, 28B.10.808, 28B.10.810, and 28B.10.822; and
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 28B.10 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) The legislature finds that the higher education coordinating
- 8 board, in consultation with the higher education community, has
- 9 completed a review of the state need grant program. It is the intent
- 10 of the legislature to endorse the board's proposed changes to the state
- 11 need grant program, including:
- 12 (a) Reaffirmation that the primary purpose of the state need grant
- 13 program is to assist low-income, needy, and disadvantaged Washington
- 14 residents attending institutions of higher education;
- 15 (b) A goal that the base state need grant amount over time be
- 16 increased to be equivalent to the rate of tuition charged to resident
- 17 undergraduate students attending Washington state public colleges and
- 18 universities;

- 1 (c) State need grant recipients be required to contribute a portion 2 of the total cost of their education through self-help;
- 3 (d) State need grant recipients be required to document their need 4 for dependent care assistance after taking into account other public 5 funds provided for like purposes; and
- 6 (e) Institutional aid administrators be allowed to determine 7 whether a student eligible for a state need grant in a given academic 8 year may remain eligible for the ensuing year if the student's family 9 income increases by no more than a marginal amount.
- 10 (2) The legislature further finds that the higher education 11 coordinating board, under its authority to implement the proposed 12 changes in subsection (1) of this section, should do so in a timely 13 manner.
- 14 (3) The legislature also finds that:
- 15 (a) In most circumstances, need grant eligibility should not extend 16 beyond five years or one hundred twenty-five percent of the published 17 length of the program in which the student is enrolled or the credit or 18 clock-hour equivalent; and
- 19 (b) State financial aid programs should continue to adhere to the 20 principle that funding follows resident students to their choice of 21 institution of higher education.
- 22 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.10.800 and 1993 sp.s. c 18 s 2 are each amended to 23 read as follows:
- The ((sole)) purposes of RCW 28B.10.800 through 28B.10.824 ((is))
- 25 <u>are</u> to establish ((a)) <u>the principles upon which the state financial</u>
- 26 <u>aid programs will be based and to establish the</u> state of Washington
- 27 ((student financial aid)) state need grant program, thus assisting
- 28 financially needy or disadvantaged students domiciled in Washington to
- 29 obtain the opportunity of attending an accredited institution of higher
- 30 education, as defined in RCW 28B.10.802(1). ((Financial aid)) State
- 31 need grants under RCW 28B.10.800 through 28B.10.824 ((is)) are
- 32 available only to students who are resident students as defined in RCW
- 33 28B.15.012(2) (a) through (d).
- 34 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28B.10.804 and 1995 c 269 s 801 are each amended to 35 read as follows:
- The ((commission)) board shall be cognizant of the following
- 37 guidelines in the performance of its duties:

- 1 (1) The ((commission)) board shall be research oriented, not only 2 at its inception but continually through its existence.
- 3 (2) The ((commission)) board shall coordinate all existing programs 4 of financial aid except those specifically dedicated to a particular 5 institution by the donor.
- (3) The ((commission)) board shall take the initiative and 6 7 responsibility for coordinating all federal student financial aid 8 programs to ((insure)) ensure that the state recognizes the maximum 9 potential effect of these programs, and shall design ((the)) state 10 programs ((which)) that complement((s)) existing federal, state, and11 institutional programs. The board shall ensure that state programs continue to follow the principle that state financial aid funding 12 follows the student to the student's choice of institution of higher 13 education. 14
- (4) Counseling is a paramount function of the state need grant and 15 other state student financial aid programs, and in most cases could 16 17 only be properly implemented at the institutional levels; therefore, state student financial aid programs shall be concerned with the 18 19 attainment of those goals which, in the judgment of the ((commission)) 20 board, are the reasons for the existence of a student financial aid program, and not solely with administration of the program on an 21 22 individual basis.
- 23 (5) The "package" approach of combining loans, grants and 24 employment for student financial aid shall be the ((conceptional)) 25 conceptual element of the state's involvement.
- 26 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28B.10.806 and 1989 c 254 s 3 are each amended to read 27 as follows:
- The ((commission)) board shall have the following powers and duties:
- 30 (1) Conduct a full analysis of student financial aid as a means of:
- 31 (a) Fulfilling educational aspirations of students of the state of
- 32 Washington, and
- 33 (b) Improving the general, social, cultural, and economic character 34 of the state.
- Such an analysis will be a continuous one and will yield current information relevant to needed improvements in the state program of student financial aid. The ((commission)) board will disseminate the

- 1 information yielded by their analyses to all appropriate individuals 2 and agents.
- 3 (((c) This study should include information on the following:
- 4 (i) all programs and sources of available student financial aid,
- 5 (ii) distribution of Washington citizens by socio-economic class,
- 6 (iii) data from federal and state studies useful in identifying:
- 7 (A) demands of students for specific educational goals in colleges, 8 and
- 9 (B) the discrepancy between high school students' preferences and 10 the colleges they actually selected.))
- (2) Design a state program of student financial aid based on the 11 data of the study referred to in this section. The state programs will 12 supplement available federal and local aid programs. 13 The state programs of student financial aid will not exceed the difference 14 15 between the budgetary costs of attending an institution of higher ((learning)) education and the student's total resources, including 16 family support, personal savings, employment, and federal, state, and 17 local aid programs. 18
- 19 (3) Determine and establish criteria for financial need of the 20 individual applicant based upon the consideration of that particular 21 applicant. In making this determination the ((commission)) board shall 22 consider the following:
 - (a) Assets and income of the student.
- 24 (b) Assets and income of the parents, or the individuals legally 25 responsible for the care and maintenance of the student.
- 26 (c) The cost of attending the institution the student is attending 27 or planning to attend.
- (d) Any other criteria deemed relevant to the ((commission)) board.
- 29 (4) Set the amount of financial aid to be awarded to any individual 30 needy or disadvantaged student in any school year.
- 31 (5) Award financial aid to needy or disadvantaged students for a 32 school year based upon only that amount necessary to fill the financial 33 gap between the budgetary cost of attending an institution of higher 34 education and the family and student contribution.
- 35 (6) Review the need and eligibility of all applications on an 36 annual basis and adjust financial aid to reflect changes in the 37 financial need of the recipients and the cost of attending the 38 institution of higher education.

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- Sec. 5. RCW 28B.10.808 and 1991 c 164 s 4 are each amended to read 1 2 as follows:
- 3 In awarding <u>need</u> grants, the ((commission)) <u>board</u> shall proceed 4 substantially as follows: PROVIDED, That nothing contained herein 5 shall be construed to prevent the ((commission)) board, in the exercise 6 of its sound discretion, from following another procedure when the best 7 interest of the program so dictates:
- (1) The ((commission)) board shall annually select the financial 8 9 aid award ((winners)) recipients from among Washington residents 10 applying for student financial aid who have been ranked according to 11 financial need as determined by the amount of the family contribution 12 and other considerations brought to the ((commission's)) board's 13 attention.
- (2) The financial need of the highest ranked students shall be met 14 15 by grants depending upon the evaluation of financial need until the total allocation has been disbursed. Funds from grants which are 16 17 declined, forfeited or otherwise unused shall be reawarded until 18 dispersed.

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- 19 (3) ((A grant may be renewed until the course of study is completed, but not for more than an additional four academic years beyond the first year of the award. These shall not be required to be consecutive years)) A student shall be eligible to receive a state need grant for up to five years, or the credit or clock hour equivalent of 24 five years, or up to one hundred twenty-five percent of the published length of time of the student's program. A student may not start a new 26 associate degree program as a state need grant recipient until at least five years have elapsed since earning an associate degree as a need grant recipient, except that a student may earn two associate degrees 29 Qualifications for renewal will include maintaining concurrently. satisfactory academic ((standing)) progress toward completion of ((the course of study, and continued eligibility)) an eligible program as determined by the ((commission)) board. Should the recipient terminate 32 his or her enrollment for any reason during the academic year, the unused portion of the grant shall be returned to the state educational grant fund by the institution according to the institution's own policy for issuing refunds, except as provided in RCW 28B.10.8081. 36
 - (4) In computing financial need, the ((commission)) board shall determine a maximum student expense budget allowance, not to exceed an amount equal to the total maximum student expense budget at the public

- 1 institutions plus the current average state appropriation per student
- 2 for operating expense in the public institutions.
- 3 **Sec. 6.** RCW 28B.10.810 and 1989 c 254 s 5 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- For a student to be eligible for ((financial aid the)) a state need grant a student must:
- 7 (1) Be a "needy student" or "disadvantaged student" as determined 8 by the ((commission)) board in accordance with RCW 28B.10.802 (3) and
- 9 (4).
- 10 (2) Have been domiciled within the state of Washington for at least 11 one year.
- 12 (3) Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment on at least a half-time
- 13 basis at an institution of higher education in Washington as defined in
- 14 RCW 28B.10.802(1).
- 15 (4) Have complied with all the rules and regulations adopted by the
- 16 ((commission)) board for the administration of RCW 28B.10.800 through
- 17 28B.10.824.
- 18 **Sec. 7.** RCW 28B.10.822 and 1973 c 62 s 4 are each amended to read 19 as follows:
- The ((commission)) board shall adopt rules ((and regulations)) as
- 21 may be necessary or appropriate for effecting the provisions of RCW
- 22 28B.10.800 through 28B.10.824 and section 1 of this act, and not in
- 23 conflict with RCW 28B.10.800 through 28B.10.824, in accordance with the
- 24 provisions of chapter 34.05 RCW, the ((state higher education))
- 25 administrative procedure act.
