- AN ACT Relating to warm water fish culture; amending RCW 77.44.050
- 2 and 77.32.440; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.44.050 and 1996 c 222 s 5 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 The warm water game fish account is hereby created in the state
- 7 wildlife fund. Moneys in the account are subject to legislative
- 8 appropriation and shall be used for the purpose of funding the warm
- 9 water game fish enhancement program, including the development of warm
- 10 water pond and lake habitat, culture of warm water game fish,
- 11 improvement of warm water fish habitat, management of warm water fish
- 12 populations, and other practical activities that will improve the
- 13 fishing for warm water fish. Funds ((from the)) for warm water game
- 14 fish ((surcharge)) as provided in RCW 77.32.440 shall not serve as
- 15 replacement funding for department-operated warm water fish projects
- 16 existing on December 31, 1994((. Funds from the warm water game fish
- 17 account shall not be used for the operation or construction of the warm
- 18 water fish culture project at Ringold unless specifically authorized by
- 19 <del>legislation.</del>

- Funds from the sale of the warm water game fish surcharges shall be 1
- deposited in the warm water game fish account)), except that an amount 2
- not to exceed ninety-one thousand dollars may be used for warm water 3
- 4 fish culture at the Rod Meseberg warm water fish production facility
- during the biennium ending June 30, 2001. 5
- Sec. 2. RCW 77.32.440 and 1998 c 191 s 13 are each amended to read 6 7 as follows:
- 8 (1) The commission shall adopt rules to continue funding current
- 9 enhancement programs at levels equal to the participation of licensees
- in each of the individual enhancement programs. All enhancement 10
- 11 funding will continue to be deposited directly into the individual
- 12 accounts created for each enhancement.
- (2) In implementing subsection (1) of this section with regard to 13
- 14 warm water game fish, the department shall ((initially)) deposit in the
- 15 warm water game fish account ((6.512 percent of the funds received from
- 16 the sale of each freshwater license and each freshwater, saltwater, and
- shellfish combination license. The percentage initially)) the sum of 17
- 18 one million two hundred fifty thousand dollars each fiscal year during
- the fiscal years 1999 and 2000, based on two hundred fifty thousand 19
- warm water anglers. Beginning in fiscal year 2001, and each year 20
- thereafter, the deposit to the warm water game fish account established 21
- 22 in this subsection shall be adjusted annually to reflect the actual
- 23 numbers of license holders fishing for warm water game fish based on an
- 24 annual survey of licensed anglers from the previous year conducted by
- 25 the department beginning with the April 1, ((2000)) 1999, to March 31,
- ((2001)) 2000, license year survey. ((The legislature expects that 26
- implementing this subsection will result in annual deposits of at least 27
- one million two hundred fifty thousand dollars into the warm water game

- Sec. 3. If specific funding for the purposes of 30 NEW SECTION.
- 31 section 1 of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number,
- is not provided by June 30, 1999, in the omnibus appropriations act, 32
- 33 section 1 of this act is null and void.
- 34 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate
- preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 35

- 1 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 2 immediately.
