1 AN ACT Relating to venue of actions by or against counties; and 2 amending RCW 36.01.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.01.050 and 1997 c 401 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) All actions against any county may be commenced in the superior 7 court of such county, or in the superior court of either of the two 8 nearest ((counties)) judicial districts. All actions by any county 9 shall be commenced in the superior court of the county in which the 10 defendant resides, or in either of the two ((counties)) judicial 11 districts nearest to the county bringing the action.

12 (2) The determination of the nearest ((<del>counties</del>)) judicial 13 <u>districts</u> is measured by the travel time between county seats using 14 major surface routes, as determined by the office of the administrator 15 for the courts.
