- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.19 RCW,
- 7 to be codified between RCW 43.19.190 and 43.19.1937, to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (1) In addition to disposing of property under RCW 28A.335.180,
- 10 39.33.010, 43.19.1919, and 43.19.1920, state-owned, surplus computers
- 11 and computer-related equipment may be donated to any school district or
- 12 educational service district under the guidelines and distribution
- 13 standards established pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.
- 14 (2) By September 1, 1999, the department and office of the
- 15 superintendent of public instruction shall jointly develop guidelines
- 16 and distribution standards for the donation of state-owned, surplus
- 17 computers and computer-related equipment to school districts and
- 18 educational service districts. The guidelines and distribution
- 19 standards shall include considerations for quality, school-district

- 1 needs, and accountability, and shall give priority to meeting the
- 2 computer-related needs of children with disabilities, including those
- 3 disabilities necessitating the portability of laptop computers.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 44.04 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- The chief clerk of the house of representatives may authorize surplus computers and computer-related equipment owned by the house,
- 8 the secretary of the senate may authorize surplus computers and
- 9 computer-related equipment owned by the senate, and the directors of
- 10 legislative agencies may authorize surplus computers and computer-
- 11 related equipment owned by his or her respective agency, to be donated
- 12 to school districts and educational service districts. This section
- 13 shall not be construed to limit the discretion of the legislature
- 14 regarding disposal of its surplus property.
