1       AN ACT Relating to the delivery of salmon into the ports of the  
2 state; and adding a new section to chapter 75.28 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 75.28 RCW  
5 to read as follows:

6       (1) The legislature finds that landing salmon into the ports of  
7 Washington state, regardless of where such salmon have been harvested,  
8 is economically beneficial to those ports as well as to the citizens of  
9 the state of Washington. It is therefore the intent of the legislature  
10 to encourage this practice.

11       (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of RCW 75.28.010(1)(b) and  
12 75.28.113, a Washington citizen who holds a valid Oregon or California  
13 salmon troll license may land salmon taken during lawful seasons in  
14 Oregon and California into Washington ports without obtaining a salmon  
15 delivery license. This exception is valid only when the salmon were  
16 taken in offshore waters south of Cape Falcon.

17       (3) The department shall adopt rules necessary to implement this  
18 section, including rules identifying the appropriate methods for  
19 verifying that salmon were in fact taken south of Cape Falcon.
