- 1 AN ACT Relating to the use of dredge spoils on the LT-1 and Cook
- 2 Ferry Road Site in Cowlitz County; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds and declares that the
- 5 December 19, 1991, Washington state conveyance of the Mt. St. Helens
- 6 Recovery Program, LT-1 and Cook Ferry Road Sites, to Cowlitz County,
- 7 should be amended to enable Cowlitz County to use dredge spoils
- 8 revenues for recreational purposes throughout the county.
- 9 The legislature further declares that the department of
- 10 transportation shall execute sufficient legal release to accomplish the
- 11 following:
- 12 (1) Dredge spoil revenues from either the LT-1 or Cook Ferry Road
- 13 Site must be dedicated for recreational facilities and recreational
- 14 administration costs throughout the county;
- 15 (2) Any mining excavation must meet the requirements of the
- 16 Shoreline Management Act of 1971 as identified in chapter 90.58 RCW;
- 17 (3) Both the LT-1 and Cook Ferry Road Site must be preserved as a
- 18 long-term dredging facility;

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- 1 (4) All other requirements in the December 19, 1991, conveyance 2 between the state of Washington and Cowlitz County will remain in 3 effect; and
- 4 (5) The LT-1 and Cook Ferry Road Site remains subject to any 5 agreements with the United States Army Corps of Engineers and other 6 agencies of the federal government.
