- 1 AN ACT Relating to career and technical student organizations;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 28A.300 RCW; and creating a new
- 3 section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that career and 6 technical student organizations:
- 7 (a) Prepare students for career experiences beyond high school;
- 8 (b) Help students develop personal, leadership, technical, and 9 occupational skills;
- 10 (c) Are an integral component of vocational technical instruction 11 programs; and
- 12 (d) Directly help students achieve state learning goals, especially
- 13 goals three and four with respect to critical thinking, problem
- 14 solving, and decision-making skills.
- 15 (2) The legislature finds that career and technical student
- 16 organizations are best situated to fulfill their important purpose if
- 17 they are in existence pursuant to statute and receive ongoing
- 18 assistance and support from the office of superintendent of public
- 19 instruction.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.300 2 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 (1) The superintendent of public instruction shall maintain support 4 state-wide coordination for career and technical organizations by providing program staff support that is available to 5 assist in meeting the needs of career and technical student 6 7 organizations and their members and students. The superintendent shall provide at least one full-time equivalent program staff for purposes of 8 9 implementing this section. The superintendent may provide additional 10 support to the organizations through contracting with independent coordinators. 11
- 12 (2) Career and technical student organizations eligible for 13 technical assistance and other support services under this section are 14 organizations recognized as career and technical student organizations 15 by:
- 16 (a) The United States department of education; or
- 17 (b) The superintendent of public instruction, if such recognition 18 is recommended by the Washington association for career and technical 19 education.
- (3) Career and technical student organizations eligible for technical assistance and other support services under this section include, but are not limited to: The national FFA organization; family, career, and community leaders of America; skillsUSA; distributive education clubs of America; future business leaders of America; and the technology student association.
