3 On page 104, line 31, increase the general fund-state
4 appropriation for fiscal year 2002 by \$2,527,000.

5 On page 104, line 32, increase the general fund-state
6 appropriation for fiscal year 2003 by \$4,664,000

7 Correct the total accordingly.

8 On page 106, beginning on line 30, after "(vi)" strike everything
9 through "school year." on line 37 and insert the following: "A maximum
10 of \$8,569,000 of the general fund-state appropriation for fiscal year
11 2002 and a maximum of \$10,692,000 of the general fund-state
12 appropriation for fiscal year 2003 are provided for a safety allocation
13 to districts subject to the following conditions and limitations:

14 (A) The funds shall be allocated at a maximum rate of \$10.00 per
15 year per full-time equivalent K-12 student. For the purposes of this
16 subsection (2)(a)(vi)(A), the "full-time equivalent student enrollment
17 of the district" means the district's average annual K-12 full-time
18 equivalent enrollment for the prior school year or 200 full-time
19 equivalent students, whichever is greater. However, if a district
20 received a school security matching grant for the 2000-01 school year
21 under section 501 (2)(e) of chapter 1, Laws of 2000 ² sp. sess. or
22 section 2 of chapter 12, Laws of 1999 sp. sess., the district's
23 allocation shall be the greater of the allocation calculated using the
24 definition of full-time equivalent student enrollment in this
25 subsection (2)(a)(vi)(A) or the district's total school security grant
26 award for the 2000-01 school year."

EFFECT: Increases the school safety allocation from \$6.36 per pupil to \$10.00 per pupil; ensures that no school district will receive less than \$2,000 per year; and ensures that no school district will receive less than it received in the current school year in school security matching grant funding.

FISCAL IMPACT:
