- 1 AN ACT Relating to the authority of the criminal justice training
- 2 commission to own and operate training facilities; amending RCW
- 3 43.101.080; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.101.080 and 1982 c 124 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 The commission shall have all of the following powers:
- 8 (1) To meet at such times and places as it may deem proper;
- 9 (2) To adopt any rules and regulations as it may deem necessary;
- 10 (3) To contract for services as it deems necessary in order to
- 11 carry out its duties and responsibilities;
- 12 (4) To cooperate with and secure the cooperation of any department,
- 13 agency, or instrumentality in state, county, and city government, and
- 14 other commissions affected by or concerned with the business of the
- 15 commission;
- 16 (5) To do any and all things necessary or convenient to enable it
- 17 fully and adequately to perform its duties and to exercise the power
- 18 granted to it;

- 1 (6) To select and employ an executive director, and to empower him 2 to perform such duties and responsibilities as it may deem necessary;
- 3 (7) To assume legal, fiscal, and program responsibility for all training conducted by the commission;
- 5 (8) To establish, by rule and regulation, standards for the 6 training of criminal justice personnel where such standards are not 7 prescribed by statute;
 - (9) To <u>own</u>, establish, and operate, or to contract with other qualified institutions or organizations for the operation of, training and education programs for criminal justice personnel and to <u>purchase</u>, lease, <u>or otherwise acquire</u>, subject to the approval of the department of general administration, a training facility or facilities necessary to the conducting of such programs((: <u>PROVIDED</u>, That the commission shall not have the power to invest any moneys received by it from any source for the purchase of a training facility without prior approval of the legislature));
- 17 (10) To establish, by rule and regulation, minimum curriculum 18 standards for all training programs conducted for employed criminal 19 justice personnel;
- (11) To review and approve or reject standards for instructors of training programs for criminal justice personnel, and to employ personnel on a temporary basis as instructors without any loss of employee benefits to those instructors;
- 24 (12) To direct the development of alternative, innovate, and 25 interdisciplinary training techniques;
- (13) To review and approve or reject training programs conducted for criminal justice personnel and rules establishing and prescribing minimum training and education standards recommended by the training standards and education boards;
- 30 (14) To allocate financial resources among training and education 31 programs conducted by the commission;
- 32 (15) To allocate training facility space among training and 33 education programs conducted by the commission;
- (16) To issue diplomas certifying satisfactory completion of any training or education program conducted or approved by the commission to any person so completing such a program;
- 37 (17) To provide for the employment of such personnel as may be 38 practical to serve as temporary replacements for any person engaged in 39 a basic training program as defined by the commission;

- 1 (18) To establish rules and regulations recommended by the training 2 standards and education boards prescribing minimum standards relating 3 to physical, mental and moral fitness which shall govern the 4 recruitment of criminal justice personnel where such standards are not 5 prescribed by statute or constitutional provision.
- All rules and regulations adopted by the commission shall be adopted and administered pursuant to the administrative procedure act, chapter 34.05 RCW, and the open public meetings act, chapter 42.30 RCW.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The legislature authorizes the department of general administration to transfer the Washington state training and conference center located at 19010 First Avenue, Burien, Washington, 12 98148, to the criminal justice training commission.
