- 1 AN ACT Relating to obstructing governmental operations; reenacting
- 2 RCW 9A.76.175 and 9A.76.020; creating a new section; and declaring an

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The purpose of this act is to respond to
- 6 State v. Thomas, 103 Wn. App. 800, by reenacting, without changes, the
- 7 law prohibiting materially false or misleading statements to public
- 8 servants, enacted as sections 32 and 33, chapter 285, Laws of 1995.
- 9 **Sec. 2.** RCW 9A.76.175 and 1995 c 285 s 32 are each reenacted to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 A person who knowingly makes a false or misleading material
- 12 statement to a public servant is quilty of a gross misdemeanor.
- 13 "Material statement" means a written or oral statement reasonably
- 14 likely to be relied upon by a public servant in the discharge of his or
- 15 her official powers or duties.
- 16 **Sec. 3.** RCW 9A.76.020 and 1995 c 285 s 33 are each reenacted to
- 17 read as follows:

- 1 (1) A person is guilty of obstructing a law enforcement officer if 2 the person willfully hinders, delays, or obstructs any law enforcement 3 officer in the discharge of his or her official powers or duties.
- 4 (2) "Law enforcement officer" means any general authority, limited 5 authority, or specially commissioned Washington peace officer or 6 federal peace officer as those terms are defined in RCW 10.93.020, and 7 other public officers who are responsible for enforcement of fire, 8 building, zoning, and life and safety codes.
 - (3) Obstructing a law enforcement officer is a gross misdemeanor.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
