- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Incorporations and annexations are exempt
- 6 from the state environmental policy act. However, there are no
- 7 comparable exemptions for reductions of city limits or
- 8 disincorporations. It is the legislature's intent to provide that a
- 9 reduction in city limits or disincorporation is not subject to the
- 10 state environmental policy act.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.21C RCW
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (1) The disincorporation of a city or town is exempt from
- 14 compliance with this chapter.
- 15 (2) The reduction of city or town limits is exempt from compliance
- 16 with this chapter.
