- 1 AN ACT Relating to dog guides and service animals; adding a new
- 2 section to chapter 9.91 RCW; creating a new section; and prescribing
- 3 penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** This act may be known and cited as Layla's
- 6 Law.
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 9.91 RCW
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (1)(a) Any person who has received notice that his or her behavior
- 10 is interfering with the use of a dog guide or service animal who
- 11 continues with reckless disregard to interfere with the use of a dog
- 12 guide or service animal by obstructing, intimidating, or otherwise
- 13 jeopardizing the safety of the dog guide or service animal user or his
- 14 or her dog guide or service animal is guilty of a misdemeanor
- 15 punishable according to chapter 9A.20 RCW, except that for a second or
- 16 subsequent offense it is a gross misdemeanor.
- 17 (b) Any person who, with reckless disregard, allows his or her dog
- 18 to interfere with the use of a dog guide or service animal by

- 1 obstructing, intimidating, or otherwise jeopardizing the safety of the
- 2 dog guide or service animal user or his or her dog guide or service
- 3 animal is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable according to chapter 9A.20
- 4 RCW, except that for a second or subsequent offense it is a gross
- 5 misdemeanor.
- 6 (2)(a) Any person who, with reckless disregard, injures, disables, 7 or causes the death of a dog guide or service animal is guilty of a 8 gross misdemeanor punishable according to chapter 9A.20 RCW.
- 9 (b) Any person who, with reckless disregard, allows his or her dog 10 to injure, disable, or cause the death of a dog guide or service animal 11 is guilty of a gross misdemeanor punishable according to chapter 9A.20 12 RCW.
- 13 (3) Any person who intentionally injures, disables, or causes the 14 death of a dog guide or service animal is guilty of a class C felony.
- 15 (4) Any person who wrongfully obtains or exerts unauthorized 16 control over a dog guide or service animal with the intent to deprive 17 the dog guide or service animal user of his or her dog guide or service 18 animal is guilty of theft in the first degree, RCW 9A.56.030.
- 19 (5)(a) In any case in which the defendant is convicted of a 20 violation of this section, he or she shall also be ordered to make full 21 restitution for all damages, including incidental and consequential 22 expenses incurred by the dog guide or service animal user and the dog 23 guide or service animal which arise out of or are related to the 24 criminal offense.
- 25 (b) Restitution for a conviction under this section shall include, 26 but is not limited to:
- (i) The value of the replacement of an incapacitated or deceased dog guide or service animal, the training of a replacement dog guide or service animal, or retraining of the affected dog guide or service animal and all related veterinary and care expenses; and
- (ii) Medical expenses of the dog guide or service animal user, training of the dog guide or service animal user, and compensation for wages or earned income lost by the dog guide or service animal user.
- 34 (6) Nothing in this section shall affect any civil remedies 35 available for violation of this section.
  - (7) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
- 37 (a) "Dog guide" means a dog that is trained for the purpose of 38 guiding blind persons or a dog trained for the purpose of assisting 39 hearing impaired persons.

- 1 (b) "Service animal" means an animal that is trained for the 2 purposes of assisting or accommodating a disabled person's sensory, 3 mental, or physical disability.
- 4 (c) "Notice" means a verbal or otherwise communicated warning 5 prescribing the behavior of another person and a request that the 6 person stop their behavior.
- 7 (d) "Value" means the value to the dog guide or service animal user 8 and does not refer to cost or fair market value.
