1 AN ACT Relating to the Puget Sound crab pot buoy tag program;
2 adding new sections to chapter 77.70 RCW; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 77.70 RCW
5 to read as follows:

6 In order to administer a Puget Sound crab pot buoy tag program, the
7 department may charge a fee to holders of a Dungeness crab--Puget Sound
8 fishery license to reimburse the department for the production of Puget
9 Sound crab pot buoy tags and the administration of a Puget Sound crab
10 pot buoy tag program.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 77.70 RCW
12 to read as follows:

13 The Puget Sound crab pot buoy tag account is created in the custody
14 of the state treasurer. All revenues from fees from section 1 of this
15 act must be deposited into the account. Expenditures from this account
16 may be used for the production of crab pot buoy tags and the
17 administration of a Puget Sound crab pot buoy tag program. Only the
18 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the

1 account. The account is subject to allotment procedures under chapter
2 43.88 RCW but no appropriation is required for expenditures.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
4 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
5 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
6 immediately.
