1 AN ACT Relating to military leave for public employees; amending
2 RCW 38.40.060; and providing an effective date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 38.40.060 and 1991 c 25 s 1 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 Every officer and employee of the state or of any county, city, or
7 other political subdivision thereof who is a member of the Washington
8 national guard or of the army, navy, air force, coast guard, or marine
9 corps reserve of the United States, or of any organized reserve or
10 armed forces of the United States shall be entitled to and shall be
11 granted military leave of absence from such employment for a period not
12 exceeding fifteen days during each (~~calendar~~) year beginning October
13 1st and ending the following September 30th. Such leave shall be
14 granted in order that the person may report for active duty, when
15 called, or take part in active training duty in such manner and at such
16 time as he or she may be ordered to active duty or active training
17 duty. Such military leave of absence shall be in addition to any
18 vacation or sick leave to which the officer or employee might otherwise
19 be entitled, and shall not involve any loss of efficiency rating,

1 privileges, or pay. During the period of military leave, the officer
2 or employee shall receive from the state, or the county, city, or other
3 political subdivision, his or her normal pay.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** This act takes effect October 1, 2001.
