3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 41.06.077 and 1975-'76 2nd ex.s. c 115 s 7 are each  
5 amended to read as follows:

6            In addition to the exemptions set forth in RCW 41.06.070, the  
7 provisions of this chapter shall not apply in the department of  
8 veterans affairs to the director, the deputy director, ~~((and to))~~ no  
9 more than two ~~((assistants))~~ assistant directors, a confidential  
10 secretary for the deputy director, and a confidential secretary for  
11 each assistant director.
