- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.15.080 and 2000 c 107 s 233 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 Based upon articulable facts that a person is engaged in fishing or
- 7 hunting activities, fish and wildlife officers have the authority to
- 8 temporarily stop the person and check for valid licenses, tags,
- 9 permits, stamps, or catch record cards, and to inspect all fish and
- 10 wildlife in possession as well as the equipment being used to ensure
- 11 compliance with the requirements of this title. For licenses purchased
- 12 over the internet or telephone, fish and wildlife officers may require
- 13 the person, if age eighteen or older, to exhibit a driver's license or
- 14 other photo identification.
- 15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.32.420 and 2000 c 107 s 272 are each amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Recreational licenses are not transferable. Upon request of a fish
- 18 and wildlife officer, ex officio fish and wildlife officer, or

1 authorized fish and wildlife employee, a person hunting for game

2 <u>animals and furbearers</u>, digging for, fishing for, or possessing

3 shellfish, or seaweed or fishing for or possessing food fish or game

4 fish for personal use shall exhibit the required recreational license

5 and write his or her signature for comparison with the signature on the

6 license. A person who has purchased a license over the internet or by

7 telephone may be required to also exhibit a valid driver's license, or

8 <u>other photo identification</u>, <u>if age eighteen or older</u>. Failure to

9 comply with the request is prima facie evidence that the person does

10 not have a license or is not the person named on the license.
