- 1 AN ACT Relating to licensing specialty producers of certain lines
- 2 of insurance; and adding a new chapter to Title 48 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 6 (1) "Communications equipment" means handsets, pagers, personal
- 7 digital assistants, portable computers, automatic answering devices,
- 8 batteries, and their accessories or other devices used to originate or
- 9 receive communications signals or service approved for coverage by rule
- 10 of the commissioner, and also includes services related to the use of
- 11 the devices.
- 12 (2) "Communications equipment insurance program" means an insurance
- 13 program as described in section 3 of this act.
- 14 (3) "Communications service" means the service necessary to send,
- 15 receive, or originate communications signals.
- 16 (4) "Customer" means a person or entity purchasing or leasing
- 17 communications equipment or communications services from a vendor.

- 1 (5) "Specialty producer license" means a license issued under 2 section 2 of this act that authorizes a vendor to offer or sell 3 insurance as provided in section 3 of this act.
- 4 (6) "Supervising agent" means an agent licensed under RCW 48.17.060 5 who provides training as described in section 4 of this act and is 6 affiliated to a licensed vendor.
- 7 (7) "Vendor" means a person or entity resident or with offices in 8 this state in the business of leasing, selling, or providing 9 communications equipment or communications service to customers.
- 10 (8) "Appointing insurer" means the insurer appointing the vendor as 11 its agent under a specialty producer license.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** (1) A vendor that intends to offer insurance under section 3 of this act must file a specialty producer license application with the commissioner. Before the commissioner issues such a license, the vendor must be appointed as the agent of one or more authorized appointing insurers under a vendor's specialty producer license.
- 18 (2) Upon receipt of an application, if the commissioner is 19 satisfied that the application is complete, the commissioner may issue 20 a specialty producer license to the vendor.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A specialty producer license authorizes a vendor and its employees and authorized representatives to offer and sell to, enroll in, and bill and collect premiums from customers for insurance covering communications equipment on a master, corporate, group, or individual policy basis.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) A vendor issued a specialty producer license may not issue insurance under section 3 of this act unless:
- 28 (a) At every location where customers are enrolled in 29 communications equipment insurance programs, written material regarding 30 the program is made available to prospective customers; and
- 31 (b) The communications equipment insurance program is operated with 32 the participation of a supervising agent who, with authorization and 33 approval from the appointing insurer, supervises a training program for 34 employees of the licensed vendor.
- 35 (2) Employees and authorized representatives of a vendor issued a 36 specialty producer license may only act on behalf of the vendor in the

- 1 offer, sale, solicitation, or enrollment of customers in a
- 2 communications equipment insurance program. The conduct of these
- 3 employees and authorized representatives within the scope of their
- 4 employment or agency is the same as conduct of the vendor for purposes
- 5 of this title.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** (1) A vendor issued a specialty producer
- 7 license under this chapter is subject to RCW 48.17.540 through
- 8 48.17.560.
- 9 (2) The commissioner may adopt rules necessary for the
- 10 implementation of this chapter, including, but not limited to, rules
- 11 governing:
- 12 (a) The specialty producer license application process, including
- 13 any forms required to be used;
- 14 (b) The standards for approval and the required content of written
- 15 materials required under section 4(1)(a) of this act;
- 16 (c) The approval and required content of training materials
- 17 required under section 4(1)(b) of this act;
- 18 (d) Establishing license fees to defray the cost of administering
- 19 the specialty producer licensure program;
- 20 (e) Establishing requirements for the remittance of premium funds
- 21 to the supervising agent under authority from the program insurer; and
- 22 (f) Determining the applicability or nonapplicability of other
- 23 provisions of this title to this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Sections 1 through 5 of this act constitute
- 25 a new chapter in Title 48 RCW.
