7 (1) To establish plans and conduct programs for advertising and 8 sales promotion, to maintain present markets, or to create new or 9 larger markets for any agricultural commodity grown in the state of 10 Washington;

(2) To provide for carrying on research studies to find more efficient methods of production, irrigation, processing, transportation, handling, and marketing of any agricultural commodity;

(3) To provide for improving standards and grades by defining,
establishing, and providing labeling requirements with respect to the
same;

17 (4) To investigate and take necessary action to prevent unfair18 trade practices;

19 (5) To provide information or communicate on matters pertaining to 20 the production, irrigation, processing, transportation, marketing, or 21 uses of an agricultural commodity produced in Washington state to any 22 elected official or officer or employee of any agency;

(6) To provide marketing information and services for producers ofan agricultural commodity;

(7) To provide information and services for meeting resource
 conservation objectives of producers of an agricultural commodity;

(8) To engage in cooperative efforts in the domestic or foreign
 marketing of food products of an agricultural commodity; ((and))
 (9) To provide for commodity-related education and training; and

1 (10) To assist and cooperate with the department or any other 2 local, state, or federal government agency in the investigation and 3 control of exotic pests and diseases that could damage or affect trade 4 of the affected commodity.

5 **Sec. 2.** RCW 15.66.140 and 2002 c 313 s 57 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

Every commodity commission shall have such powers and duties in accordance with provisions of this chapter as may be provided in the marketing order and shall have the following powers and duties:

10 (1) To elect a chair and such other officers as determined 11 advisable;

12 (2) To adopt, rescind and amend rules and regulations reasonably 13 necessary for the administration and operation of the commission and 14 the enforcement of its duties under the marketing order;

(3) To administer, enforce, direct and control the provisions ofthe marketing order and of this chapter relating thereto;

17 (4) To employ and discharge at its discretion such administrators 18 and additional personnel, attorneys, advertising and research agencies 19 and other persons and firms that it may deem appropriate and pay 20 compensation to the same;

12 (14) To enter into contracts or agreements for research in the 13 production, irrigation, processing, transportation, marketing, use, or 14 distribution of an affected commodity;

15 (15) To retain in emergent situations the services of private legal 16 counsel to conduct legal actions on behalf of a commission. The 17 retention of a private attorney is subject to review by the office of 18 the attorney general;

19 (16) To engage in appropriate fund-raising activities for the 20 purpose of supporting activities of the commission authorized by the 21 marketing order;

(17) To participate in international, federal, state, and local hearings, meetings, and other proceedings relating to the production, irrigation, manufacture, regulation, transportation, distribution, sale, or use of affected commodities including activities authorized under RCW 42.17.190, including the reporting of those activities to the public disclosure commission;

(18) To maintain a list of the names and addresses of affected producers that may be compiled from information used to collect assessments under the provisions of the marketing order and data on the value of each producer's production for a minimum three-year period;

32 (19) To maintain a list of the names and addresses of persons who 33 handle the affected commodity within the affected area and data on the 34 amount and value of the commodity handled for a minimum three-year 35 period by each person; ((and))

36 (20) <u>To request records and audit the records of producers or</u>

handlers of the affected commodity during normal business hours to
 determine whether the appropriate assessment has been paid;

3 (21) To acquire or own intellectual property rights, licenses, or 4 patents and to collect royalties resulting from commission-funded 5 research related to the affected commodity; and

6 (22) Such other powers and duties that are necessary to carry out 7 the purposes of this chapter.

8 **Sec. 3.** RCW 15.66.185 and 2002 c 313 s 62 are each amended to read 9 as follows:

10 (1) Any funds of any agricultural commodity commission may be 11 invested in savings or time deposits in banks, trust companies, and 12 mutual savings banks that are doing business in the United States, up 13 to the amount of insurance afforded such accounts by the Federal 14 Deposit Insurance Corporation.

15 (2) This section shall apply to all funds which may be lawfully so 16 invested, which in the judgment of any agricultural commodity 17 commission are not required for immediate expenditure. The authority 18 granted by this section is not exclusive and shall be construed to be 19 cumulative and in addition to other authority provided by law for the 20 investment of such funds, including, but not limited to, authority 21 granted under chapters 39.58, 39.59, and 43.84 RCW.

22 **Sec. 4.** RCW 15.66.110 and 2002 c 313 s 51 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

(1) Every marketing order shall establish a commodity commission 24 25 composed of not less than five nor more than ((thirteen)) fifteen ((In addition, the director shall be an ex officio member of 26 members. each commodity commission unless otherwise specified in the marketing 27 Commission members shall be citizens and residents of this 28 order.)) state if required by the marketing order, and over the age of eighteen. 29 30 Not more than one commission member may be part of the same "person" as defined by this chapter. The term of office of commission members 31 shall be three years with the terms rotating so than one-third of the 32 terms will commence as nearly as practicable each year. However, the 33 34 first commission shall be selected, one-third for a term of one year, 35 one-third for a term of two years, and one-third for a term of three

The legislature hereby charges 11 each commission, with oversight by the director, to speak on behalf of 12 Washington state government with regard to its particular commodity.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. RCW 15.66.115 (When director appoints 14 majority of the commission--Nominations--Advisory vote--Notice--15 Director appoints candidate receiving the most votes--Exception) and 16 2002 c 313 s 53 are each repealed.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 12. A new section is added to chapter 15.65 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 The costs incurred by the department associated with the 8 implementation of section 10 of this act shall be paid for by the 9 affected commodity commissions.

10 **Sec. 13.** RCW 15.28.020 and 2002 c 313 s 105 are each amended to 11 read as follows:

The commission is composed of ((sixteen)) seventeen voting members, 12 as follows: Ten producers, four dealers, and two processors, who are 13 14 ((elected and qualified)) appointed as provided in this chapter. The director, or an authorized representative, shall be ((an ex officio 15 member without a vote)) a voting member of the commission. Other 16 sections of this chapter that relate to the selection of voting members 17 shall not apply to the director or his or her authorized 18 19 representative.

A majority of the voting members constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business.

22 **Sec. 14.** RCW 15.28.040 and 1967 c 191 s 3 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

Of the producer members, four shall be ((elected)) appointed from the first district and occupy positions one, two, three and four; four shall be ((elected)) appointed from the second district and occupy positions five, six, seven and eight, and two shall be ((elected)) appointed from the third district and occupy positions nine and ten.

Of the dealer members, two shall be ((elected)) appointed from each of the first and second districts and respectively occupy positions eleven and twelve from the first district and positions thirteen and fourteen from the second district.

position previously referred to as position twelve shall henceforth be position thirteen. (3) Not less than sixty days nor more than seventy-five days prior 19 20 to the commencement of a commission member's term, the director shall 21 cause an advisory vote to be held for the director-appointed positions. 22 Advisory ballots shall be mailed to all affected producers and shall be 23 returned to the director not less than thirty days prior to the commencement of the term. The advisory ballot shall be conducted in a 24 25 manner so that it is a secret ballot. The names of the two candidates receiving the most votes in the advisory vote shall be forwarded to the 26 director for potential appointment to the commission. In the event 27 there are only two candidates nominated for a position, an advisory 28 29 vote may not be held and the candidates' names shall be forwarded to 30 the director for potential appointment. If only one candidate is nominated for a position, the commission shall select a second 31 candidate whose name will be forwarded to the director. 32

33 (4) Any candidate whose name is forwarded to the director for 34 potential appointment shall submit to the director a letter stating why

he or she wishes to be appointed to the commission. The director may
 select either person for the position.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 17. A new section is added to chapter 15.28 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 To accomplish the transition to a commission structure where the 6 director appoints a majority of commission members, the names of the 7 currently elected commission members shall be forwarded to the director 8 for appointment to the commission within thirty days of the effective 9 date of this act. Thereafter, the director shall appoint commission 10 members pursuant to section 16 of this act as the current commission 11 member terms expire.

12 **Sec. 18.** RCW 15.28.060 and 1967 c 191 s 6 are each amended to read 13 as follows:

14 The director shall call meetings at times and places concurred upon 15 by the director and the commission for the purpose of nominating producer, dealer or processor members for ((election)) potential 16 appointment to the commission when such members' terms are about to 17 Notice of such meetings shall be given at least sixty days 18 expire. prior to the time the respective members' term is about to expire. Any person qualified to serve on the commission may be nominated orally at ((said)) the nomination meetings. Written nominations, signed by five persons qualified to vote for the said nominee, may be made for five days subsequent to ((said)) the nomination meeting. Such

written nominations shall be filed with the commission at its Yakima
 office.

3 ((Members of the commission shall be elected by a)) The director
4 shall cause an advisory vote to be held for commission positions. The
5 advisory vote shall be by secret mail ballot((, and such election shall
6 be conducted under the supervision of the director, and the elected
7 candidate shall become a member of the commission upon certification of
8 the director that said elected candidate has satisfied the required
9 qualifications for membership on the commission.

10 When only one nominee is nominated for any position on the commission, the director shall, if such nominee satisfies the 11 12 requirements of the position for which he was nominated, certify the 13 said nominee as to his qualifications and then it shall be deemed that 14 said nominee has been duly elected. Nominees receiving a majority of the votes in an election shall be considered to have been elected and 15 if more than one position is to be filled in a district or at large, 16 17 the nominees respectively receiving the largest number of votes shall be deemed to have been elected to fill the vacancies from said 18 districts or areas on the commission)). Persons qualified to vote for 19 members of the commission shall, except as otherwise provided by law or 20 21 rule or regulation of the commission, vote only in the district in 22 which their activities make them eligible to vote for a potential member of the commission. 23

A producer to be eligible to vote in ((an election)) the advisory vote for a nominee as a producer member of the commission must be a commercial producer of soft tree fruits paying assessments to the commission.

When a legal entity acting as a producer, dealer, or processor is qualified to vote for a candidate in any district or area to serve in a specified position on the commission, such legal entity may cast only one vote for such candidate, regardless of the number of persons comprising such legal entity or stockholders owning stock therein.

33 Sec. 19. RCW 15.28.070 and 1967 c 191 s 7 are each amended to read 34 as follows:

The commission shall have the authority, subject to the provisions of chapter 34.05 RCW (Administrative Procedure Act), for adopting rules

and regulations, after public hearing, establishing one or more subdistricts in any one of the three districts. Such subdistricts shall include a substantial portion of the soft tree fruit producing area in the district in which they are formed.

5 The commission shall, when a subdistrict has been formed within one 6 of the districts as in this section provided for, assign one of the 7 districts' producer positions on the commission to said subdistrict. 8 Such producer position may only be filled by a producer residing in 9 such subdistrict, whether by ((election,)) apportionment((-,)) or 10 appointment.

The dairy products commission shall be composed of not more than 21 22 ten members. There shall be one member from each district who shall be a practical producer of dairy products ((to be elected by such 23 24 producers)), one member shall be a dealer, and one member shall be a producer who also acts as a dealer((, and such dealer and producer who 25 acts as a dealer shall be appointed by the director of agriculture, 26 and)). The director of agriculture shall be ((an ex officio member 27 28 without vote)) a voting member of the commission.

29 <u>As used in this chapter, "director" means the director of</u> 30 <u>agriculture or his or her authorized representative</u>.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 25. A new section is added to chapter 15.44 RCW 32 to read as follows:

33 (1) The director shall appoint the members of the commission.

1 (2) Candidates for producer member positions on the commission 2 shall be nominated under RCW 15.44.033.

Advisory ballots shall be mailed to all 4 affected producers in the district where a vacancy is about to occur 5 and shall be returned to the director not less than thirty days prior 6 to the commencement of the term. 7 The advisory ballot shall be conducted in a manner so that it is a secret ballot. 20 **Sec. 26.** RCW 15.44.033 and 1995 c 374 s 59 are each amended to 21 read as follows:

Producer members of the commission shall be nominated ((and elected)) by producers within the district that such producer members represent in the year in which a commission member's term shall expire. ((Such producer members receiving the largest number of the votes cast in the respective districts which they represent shall be elected. The election shall be by secret mail ballot and under the supervision of the director.))

Nomination for candidates to be ((elected)) appointed to the 29 commission shall be conducted by mail by the director. Such nomination 30 31 forms shall be mailed by the director to each producer in a district where a vacancy is about to occur. Such mailing shall be made on or 32 after April 1st, but not later than April 10th of the year the 33 commission vacancy will occur. The nomination form shall provide for 34 35 the name of the producer being nominated and the names of five 36 producers nominating such nominee. The producers nominating such

5 All nominations as provided for herein shall be returned to the 6 director by April 30th, and the director shall not accept any 7 nomination postmarked later than midnight April 30th, nor place the 8 candidate thereon on the <u>advisory</u> election ballot.

9 <u>Advisory vote ballots</u> for electing ((members)) <u>nominees</u> to the 10 commission will be mailed by the director to all eligible producers no 11 later than May 15th, in districts where <u>advisory</u> elections are to be 12 held and such ballots to be valid shall be returned postmarked no later 13 than May 31st of the year mailed, to the director in Olympia.

14 ((If only one person is nominated for a position on the 15 commission,)) The director shall determine whether the ((person 16 possesses)) persons nominated possess the qualifications required by 17 statute for the position ((and, if the director determines that the 18 person possesses such qualifications, the director shall declare that 19 the person has been duly elected)).

20 Sec. 27. RCW 15.44.035 and 2002 c 313 s 90 are each amended to 21 read as follows:

(1) The commission shall prior to each <u>advisory</u> election, in sufficient time to satisfy the requirements of RCW 15.44.033, furnish the director with a list of all producers within the district for which the <u>advisory</u> election is being held. The commission shall require each dealer and shipper in addition to the information required under RCW 15.44.110 to furnish the commission with a list of names of producers whose milk they handle.

(2) Any producer may on his or her own motion file his or her name
 with the commission for the purpose of receiving notice of <u>the advisory</u>

(4) For all purposes of giving notice, holding referenda, and
