Background:

The Public Works Assistance Account, commonly known as the Public Works Trust Fund, was created by the Legislature in 1985 to provide a source of loan funds to assist local governments and special purpose districts with infrastructure projects. The Public Works Board, within the Department of Community, Trade and Economic Development (DCTED), is authorized to make low-interest or interest-free loans to finance the repair, replacement, or improvement of the following public works systems: Bridges; roads;

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water and sewage systems; and solid waste and recycling facilities. All local governments except port districts and school districts are eligible to receive loans. In addition to construction projects, the Public Works Assistance Account can also be used for emergency loans, preconstruction loans, and capital facility planning loans.

Summary of Substitute Bill:

The substitute bill creates a subaccount in the Public Works Assistance Account to receive money to fund water storage projects and water systems facilities projects. Any projects funded by the subaccount must follow the competitive bid requirements applicable to Public Works Trust Fund projects. The subaccount is administered by the Public Works Board and is separate from the other programs managed by the Public Works Board.

Substitute Bill Compared to Original Bill:

The substitute bill clarifies the creation of the subaccount and that it is separate from other Public Works Trust Fund programs.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not Requested.

Effective Date of Substitute Bill: The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Testimony For: This bill creates a subaccount to handle appropriations for water storage and water systems facilities projects managed by an agency with a good track record in this area.
