Synopsis as Enacted

Brief Description: Specifying when vacancies in certain offices may be filled.

Sponsors: By Representatives Hudgins, Nixon, Flannigan, Pettigrew, Clibborn, Kenney, Haigh, Hinkle, Bailey, Morrell and Upthegrove.

Background:

If a legislative or partisan county office is vacated, the county legislative body must appoint someone to serve until the successor is elected at the next general election. Once the election results are certified, the successor must take office immediately.

Summary:

In an election year, if a vacancy occurs in a legislative or partisan county office after the general election but before the start of the next term, the successor may take office immediately after the election results are certified if he or she is of the same political party as the incumbent. If the successor is of a different political party than the incumbent, a vacancy must be filled through the appointment process.
