Background:

The Medical Assistance Administration, within the Department of Social and Health Services (Department), administers various health care programs for qualified, lowincome people, including the Medicaid program, the children's health program, the limited casualty program, and other state-funded medical care services. The Medical Assistance Administration is authorized to establish copayment, deductible, or coinsurance requirements for recipients of these medical programs.
