1 AN ACT Relating to transportation funding and appropriations;
2 amending 2002 c 359 ss 207, 208, 210, 211, 212, 213, 214, 215, 223,
3 226, 401, 402, 403, and 404 (uncodified); amending 2001 2nd sp.s. c 14
4 s 303 (uncodified); making appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8 (1) As a result of the elimination of the vehicle inspection number
9 (VIN) program, no permanent Washington state patrol employee shall be
10 displaced from employment without the opportunity to fill a vacant
11 patrol position for which he or she has a preference and meets the
12 minimum qualifications. For the purpose of the VIN program
13 elimination, the guidelines under chapter 356-26 WAC (Registers-
14 Certifications) shall be suspended for those employees holding the
15 classification of VIN 1 or 2.

16 (2) To the extent possible, the agency shall transfer displaced VIN
17 personnel into the 20 newly created school bus inspection and motor
18 carrier safety assistance program positions. The agency shall fill
19 existing vacant positions within the commercial vehicle division with
20 displaced VIN personnel. The agency shall report by December 31, 2001,
21 to the senate and house of representatives transportation committees on
22 efforts to relocate displaced VIN personnel.

24 (1) The appropriation is based on the budgeted expenditure of
25 (~~(\$35,159,000)~~) \$32,691,000 for vessel operating fuel in the 2001-2003
26 biennium. If the actual cost of fuel is less than this budgeted
27 amount, the excess amount may not be expended. If the actual cost
28 exceeds this amount, the department shall request a supplemental
29 appropriation.

30 (2) The appropriation provides for the compensation of ferry
31 employees. The expenditures for compensation paid to ferry employees
32 during the 2001-2003 biennium may not exceed \$207,065,000 plus a dollar
33 amount, as prescribed by the office of financial management, that is
34 equal to any insurance benefit increase granted general government
35 employees in excess of \$432.82 a month annualized per eligible marine
36 employee multiplied by the number of eligible marine employees for the

1 respective fiscal year, a dollar amount as prescribed by the office of
2 financial management for costs associated with pension amortization
3 charges, and a dollar amount prescribed by the office of financial
4 management for salary increases during the 2001-2003 biennium. For the
5 purposes of this section, the expenditures for compensation paid to
6 ferry employees shall be limited to salaries and wages and employee
7 benefits as defined in the office of financial management's policies,
8 regulations, and procedures named under objects of expenditure "A" and
9 "B" (7.2.6.2).

10 The prescribed salary and insurance benefit increase or decrease
11 dollar amount that shall be allocated from the governor's compensation
12 appropriations is in addition to the appropriation contained in this
13 section and may be used to increase or decrease compensation costs,
14 effective July 1, 2001, and thereafter, as established in the 2001-2003
15 general fund operating budget.

16 (3) The department shall issue a request for information from
17 entities interested in purchasing advertising on board Washington state
18 ferry vessels. The department shall evaluate the proposals and report
19 back to the legislature's transportation committees in January 2002
20 regarding the potential for revenue from different types of
21 advertising.

22 (4) The department may enter into contracts with private vendors to
23 sell ferry tickets and medium at locations other than Washington state
24 ferry terminals or facilities.

25 (a) The department may enter into the contracts only (i) with
26 private vendors that are already established businesses offering goods
27 for sale to the general public; and (ii) if it determines that the
28 vendor's established location has the potential to serve a significant
29 percentage of the customers using a particular ferry route.

30 (b) The department may adopt necessary rules and procedures to
31 allow the use of credit and debit cards to purchase ferry tickets or
32 medium from a private vendor who has contracted with the department to
33 sell ferry tickets or medium. The department may establish a
34 convenience fee to be paid by all persons purchasing ferry tickets and
35 medium at locations other than Washington state ferry terminals or
36 facilities. The convenience fee must be sufficient to offset the
37 charges imposed on the department by the credit and debit card
38 companies. In no event may the use of credit or debit cards authorized

1 by this section create a loss of revenue to the state. The use of a
2 personal credit card does not rely upon the credit of the state as
3 prohibited by Article VIII, section 5 of the state Constitution.

4 (5) The legislature recognizes the value of a regional fare
5 collection system to promote intermodal travel throughout Washington
6 state ferries' Puget Sound service area and therefore encourages the
7 department to resume participation in the regional fare coordination
8 project (smart card). The department shall develop a request for
9 funding of the on-going operating costs associated with the regional
10 fare coordination project and shall present this request to the 2003
11 legislature. The request for funding shall be sufficient to support a
12 system that prevents the disclosure of personally identifying
13 information of persons who use a smart card to facilitate payment of
14 ferry fares. The requested system may facilitate the disclosure of
15 aggregate information on fare collection to governmental agencies or
16 groups concerned with public transportation or public safety as long as
17 the data does not contain any personally identifying information. The
18 requested system shall not prevent the release of personally
19 identifying information to law enforcement agencies when required by a
20 subpoena.
